

Police investigate Oak Cliff murder

Dallas police have identified the man found shot to death on an Oak Cliff street as Joseph "Joey" Paul, 47.

According to reports, residents in the 1900 block of Elmwood Boulevard, just east of Hampton Road, told police that shortly after 1 a.m. Thursday, May 19, they heard loud arguing, followed by gunshots. Then they saw a body lying in the street and two men in a silver car speeding away.

Paul lived with his partner, Jeff Phillips, less than a mile from where he was killed, and Phillips said Friday afternoon, May 20, that police told him Paul had only his phone with him when he was found.

"They told me he didn't have a wallet on him when they found him, and I haven't been able to find his wallet here at the house," Phillips said. "His cell phone is pass-code locked. They asked me if I know his pass code, but I don't. He didn't know mine either."

Phillips said that he and Paul have been renovating their home and that dust from the construction had aggravated his asthma. He said he had left the house about 9 p.m. Thursday to spend the night elsewhere to get out of the dust and give his asthma time to recede.

Because he had no wallet and they were unable to access his phone, it took awhile for police to

identify Paul, Phillips said. And even after they identified Paul, they didn't immediately notify his partner of almost 16 years.

Police are asking that anyone with information regarding the death of Joey Paul call investigators at 214-671-3661. People who want to remain anonymous can call Crime Stoppers at 214-373-8477.

Texas sues feds because protecting all children is unconstitutional

Texas joined 10 other states in a lawsuit against the federal government to stop an Obama administration directive that requires all students — including transgender students — be protected and treated equally.

Not to be outdone by Texas Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick who got all the attention a couple of weeks ago for defending public bathrooms everywhere, Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton, in a press conference announcing that Texas is joining the plaintiffs in the suit, called the order from the administration "outside the bounds of the Constitution."

"Our schools are now in the crosshairs of the Obama Administration, which maintains it will punish those schools who do not comply with its orders," Paxton said in a written statement. "These schools are facing the potential loss of school funding simply for following common sense policies that protect their students.

"This represents just the latest example of the current administration's attempts to accomplish by executive fiat what they couldn't accomplish through the democratic process in Congress," Paxton added. "By forcing his policies by executive action, President Obama excluded the voice of the people. We stand today to ensure those voices are heard."

Paxton, who is facing federal civil charges and state criminal charges related to securities fraud, between the time he took office in January 2015 and November 2015, sued the federal government six times at a cost of nearly a quarter of a million (taxpayer) dollars. The first time he sued the feds was over the administration's policy of extending spousal benefits to married same-sex federal employees.

And by the way, since President Obama was first elected in 2008, Paxton and his predecessor — now-Gov. Greg Abbott — have spent more than \$5 million suing the federal government more than 39 times.

Hairstylists Marshall Hatley and Kevin Walsh maintain some of the most famous hair in Texas, and around the country: That of the Dallas Cowboy Cheerleaders

Marshall Hatley and Kevin Walsh are excited about where their careers are headed. Tangerine Salon, where both have worked for a decade, has been chosen as the sponsored salon for the Dallas Cowboys Cheerleaders for the next five years as well as for Rhythm & Blue, the squad's hip-hop dance group.

A lot of work and a little bit of luck have turned the pair into two of the busiest hair stylists in Dallas.

One of the other stylists at the salon was doing DCC Director Kelli Finglass' hair. Hatley was doing her children's.

"We've been cultivating a relationship with her," Hatley said.

When the contract with the cheerleader's previous salon ran out, Finglass chose Tangerine for the squad's hair and makeup.

"The girls are amazing to work with," Walsh said.
"Bubbly. Exactly what you'd expect."
Hatley and Walsh started by working on some of the veterans. The 201617 team is just now being finalized.
In April, Walsh

In April, Wa j u d g e d Rhythm & Blue auditions, and Hatley w a s among t h e



"Can you make her look DCC ready?" Walsh said they asked.

The cheerleader auditions began with 500 women from around the world. In the first

around the world. In the first round, that number was cut to 105. The second round of preliminaries cut the roster of hopefuls down to 50.

Then they brought in the veterans.

Judges, Finglass and DCC choreographer Judy Trammell chose 44 women to take to camp, where they are now. That number will be cut to 36 in time for football season.

"They love their long hair," Walsh said of the DCC leaders. "They want their girls to look classic and traditional."

By that, he explained, they mean they don't want the cheerleaders wearing stylish fads. No trends. He and Hatley viewed videos going back a number of years and noted that the cheerleaders' hairstyles haven't changed much over the past several years.

During the season, Hatley and Walsh said they'll not only be styling many of the cheerleaders, but teaching them maintenance as well. "We'll teach them how to do a certain curl and maintenance," Walsh said.

They also choose the right color. Hatley gave an example of one cheerleader who is Latina. He said her hair was too blonde. So, he said, "We brought her hair to a warmer color."

Working with the cheerleaders involves more than preparing them for

performing on the field during football season. It also involves appearing on Dallas Cowboys Cheerleaders: Making the Team, the reality series that's been running on CMT since 2006. One episode will be filmed in the salon. A premiere date hasn't been announced yet, but the eight-episode season should start the beginning of August.

Hatley said they've been watching the old episodes to know what to expect and have everything they'll need on hand.

It's not OK to tell one cheerleader she needs extensions and not have them on hand, he said. All the filming has to be done in one day and they need to be prepared for any situation that may arise.

Filming also took place during the final round of tryouts and Hatley may be in that early episode in the series as well.

Both Hatley and Walsh have been with Tangerine since the beginning of their careers. Hatley said owners Brandon and Janet Hensley hired him out of cosmetology school and have nurtured his career ever since.

Hatley and Walsh grew up together in Coppell. Hatley came out at 13, Walsh at 16. Walsh

took a year off before following his friend's path through cosmetology school and a career at Tangerine.

Since the two joined the salon, the Hensleys' company has grown from one location in Coppell to four in the Dallas area. Hatley and Walsh work in the newest shop, on the corner of Walnut Hill Road and Central Expressway.

Both stylists have developed a close relationship with their salon's owners.

"If I were getting married, they'd be there," Hatley said. "If my parents didn't support me, they'd be walking me down the aisle."

Brandon Hensley said he was proud of his staff that has made his company what it is.

"While our main job is to make people look and feel their best, the byproduct of success is seeing young men like Marshall Hatley and Kevin Walsh develop into world class stylists and people," Brandon Hensley said. "Just 10 years ago, they joined our company as budding talent when it was only 12 people and one location. Now, with four locations and more than 100 professionals, we couldn't be more elated to see our team serving such clients as the Dallas Cowboys Cheerleaders."

<u>Trumping the Supreme Court</u>

One of the most important issues in the 2016 presidential election is who will pick the next Supreme Court justice. Here's the rundown on Trump's possible selections

With the most important victories in LGBT equality coming through the courts and especially in Supreme Court rulings over the last decade plus, future judicial appointments are one of the most important factors in the 2016 presidential elections for the LGBT community.

Presumptive GOP nominee Donald Trump has said for a long time that, when it comes to U.S. Supreme Court justices, he likes people like Clarence Thomas and the late Antonin Scalia. The recently-released list of judges he thinks might fill the bill should he get to nominate someone to the nation's highest court includes 11 names — six judges on federal appeals courts, five on state supreme courts.

All of them are relatively conservative and some clerked for Scalia or Thomas. Many have addressed



an LGBT-related case in the course of their careers on the bench and, most of the time, their rulings came down against the LGBT party to the case.

The purpose of the list appears to be an attempt by Trump to reassure Republicans who worry that, as president, he would not be reliably conservative. In March, he reassured them that the right-wing Heritage Foundation was helping him prepare the list. Heritage Foundation spends a great deal of time and resources opposing such things as marriage equality, transgender accommodation in public restrooms and religious exemptions to non-discrimination laws.

In a May 19 interview with Fox News' Sean Hannity, Trump emphasized that he also got help preparing the list from the conservative Federalist Society and U.S. Sen. Jeff Sessions, R-Ala. And initial reaction to the list from various conservative groups and figures was strongly supportive.

But Trump also gave himself some wiggle room. In a May 18 press release announcing the list, he couched the names as "representative of the kind of constitutional principles I value," and said he would use it as a "guide" in choosing a Supreme Court nominee.

In a Twitter post that night, he said he "may be adding to the list." The next day, he told Hannity, "This would be the list I would either choose from

or pick people very close in terms of the spirit and the meaning of what they represent."

Columnists in various conservative publications and blogs began to pick up on the hedge. One, in the National Review, said it "smacks of desperate pandering to conservatives" and questioned whether Trump "actually means any of this...." Another, from the Volokh Conspiracy, called the list "meaningless," saying that Trump's calling it a "guide" is "not a commitment to choosing from the list."


Even the head of a Heritage Foundation affiliate told Fox News Sunday the list "gets a question mark at the end Does he really mean it? Is this a fraud?"


National LGBT legal groups did not respond to requests for comments on the list, but given Trump's well-known proclivity for self-contradiction and memory lapse, the future value of his Supreme Court list is a "question mark." For whatever value it might have now in providing a guide to the Republican presidential candidate's mindset, here is a glimpse into what the records of the 11 judges are on LGBT-related concerns:

• **Steven Colloton** of Iowa, 53, 8th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. In a decision he authored for a 2-to-1 majority in December 2005, Colloton affirmed

immigration authorities' decisions to deny asylum to a gay man from Zimbabwe. William Kimumwe came to the U.S. three years after Zimbabwe President Robert Mugabe declared homosexuality to be illegal and began making anti-homosexual pronouncements. The immigration judge said that Mugabe's hostility to gays was "insufficient to establish a well-founded fear" of persecution. Colloton said Kimumwe did not establish evidence that his return to Zimbabwe would necessarily lead to "serious mistreatment."


In September 2013, Colloton authored a 2-to-1 panel decision that said a district court had wrongly denied a preliminary motion to an evangelical Christian that would have enabled him to distribute Bibles during a Twin Cities Pride Festival in a public park in Minneapolis. But Colloton also joined a unanimous three-judge panel decision in December 2006 that affirmed the right of a group of pro-LGBT students to a preliminary injunction that gave them equal access to facilities at their public school.

• Thomas Hardiman of Pennsylvania, 50, 3rd Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. In August 2009, Hardiman wrote an opinion for a three-judge panel, saying a gay man could not say he was discriminated against because of religion when he was fired because his employer's religious beliefs were that "a man should not lay with another man." However, the Hardiman panel ruled that the gay employee's claim that he was discriminated against "because of sex" should have been submitted to a jury.

• Raymond Kethledge of Michigan, 49, 6th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. Kethledge joined a 2to-1 majority in a 2012 decision that dismissed the claims of three pastors who said the federal Matthew Shepard-James Byrd Hate Crimes Prevention Act violated their religious beliefs against gay people. The three claimed they had a right to exercise their religious beliefs by publicly denouncing homosexuality and that the Hate Crimes law would chill their exercise of religion. The majority agreed with the district court that, because the pastors were attempting to try a hypothetical situation, they did not having standing to challenge the law.

In 2012, Kethledge joined a panel decision against a man who was subjected to relentless harassment by another male employee. The panel said the victim's claim of a hostile work environment under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act could not stand because the man could not prove that his harasser was bisexual or gay. That same year, Kethledge also joined a panel decision that ruled against a woman who lost her job with a university in Ohio after she penned an op-ed piece for a local newspaper objecting to comparisons between the black and gay civil rights movements. The op-ed also expressed opposition to non-discrimination policies that she was responsible for enforcing at the university.

• Diane Sykes of Wisconsin, 58, 7th Circuit U.S.



Court of Appeals. Sykes wrote a 2-to-1 panel decision in 2006 that granted the Christian Legal Society a preliminary injunction to be recognized as a student group at the Southern Illinois University School of Law despite its policy of banning gay members, in violation of campus policy. In 2009, Sykes authored a three-judge panel decision that ruled against two employees who claimed their religious beliefs against homosexuality caused them to be subjected to discrimination based on religion by their employer. The panel decision noted that one employee "repeatedly violated" the employer's overtime policy and the other had "a long history of performance problems."


In 2013, Sykes authored a panel decision that upheld the right of businesses to cite the religious beliefs of their owners to discriminate against employees by denying health coverage for contraception. In writing the opinion, she discussed a hypothetical case of a pie-making company run by devout Baptists refusing coverage to a gay employee's spouse and child. She said it was "far from clear" how the case would come out.


• Raymond Gruender of Missouri, 52, 8th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. In 2008, Gruender joined a panel ruling against a gay male nurse with HIV who claimed he was fired based on disability discrimination. In a 2012 case involving a member of the Westboro Baptist Church, Gruender joined the full circuit court to uphold a city ordinance restricting protests near funerals. In a 2016 panel decision, Gruender joined a procedural ruling in favor of a member of the Westboro Baptist Church who said the state of Missouri's restrictions on protests near funerals violated her rights to free exercise of religion and speech.

• William Pryor of Alabama, 54, 11th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. Pryor joined a three-judge panel decision this year that said the court had no author-

Dallas man headed to California to ride AIDS LifeCycle in memory of loved ones

When AIDS LifeCycle leaves San Francisco for Los Angeles, Dallas will be represented by Cam Posani, riding in his second event, and Linda Griffith, who will be preparing meals for the riders

Now in its 23rd year, AIDS LifeCycle bike ride benefits the Los Angeles LGBT Center and the San Francisco AIDS Foundation that brings visibility to HIV prevention and care.

Posani is riding in memory of his brother, John Anthony Posani, and his partner, Rene Saxon, as well as his friends John and Chris, all of whom were lost to AIDS.

Dallas used to have its own AIDS rides — first, the Texas Tanqueray AIDS Ride from Houston to Dallas, and then the Lone Star Rides through North Texas. Those rides failed to attract enough riders to become profitable enough to continue.

The Texas Tanqueray rides drew about 700 riders, but had huge expenses. While the Lone Star Rides attracted just a couple of hundred riders, expenses were much lower and returned about \$100,000 to local beneficiaries each year.

AIDS LifeCycle is more successful. With 2,500 riders from around the country, AIDS LifeCycle raised \$15 million in 2015, making it the world's largest AIDS fundraiser.

Posani said he's been biking all his

life, but not until he saw a poster for AIDS LifeCycle a couple of years ago did he consider participating in a group ride.

To get himself in shape, Posani said he's been riding some every day, although not as much as he'd like. His goal this year is to finish more of the ride than he did last time.

The 545-mile route travels along on the magnificent coastal Highway 1 as well as through parts of central California. That route is part of what attracts people from around the world to participate.

Posani said riders call one particularly challenging hill on the route "the quad buster." He said he walked his bike part of that climb, but others rode up and down the hill four or five times before continuing toward L.A.

But, Posani said, he has a great excuse for only doing 385 of the 545 miles and passing up the mountainous climbs: "At 64, I'm not the young stud I used to be."

During the inland portion of the ride, Posani said the song "Strawberry Fields" kept going through his mind. As he watched migrant workers picking strawberries at the farms lining the route, he gained a new appreciation for how hard agricultural workers work.

ity to review a Haitian transgender man's petition to stay in this country because he had been convicted of crimes and had failed to establish a likelihood of future persecution.

In 2011, Pryor joined two other judges to affirm a district court ruling in favor of a transgender employee. The employee claimed her employer fired her based on sex and because of her gender identity disorder. The district court ruled for her on the basis of sex discrimination. Citing the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark decision in Price Waterhouse v. Hopkins, the panel agreed that "discriminating against someone on the basis of his or her gender non-conformity constitutes sex-based discrimination under the equal protection clause."

That same year, Pryor also concurred in a decision that upheld the right of a university to require a student seeking a masters in student counseling to follow a "remediation plan" to improve her ability to counsel LGBT students. The student sued, saying being gay is wrong and is a "lifestyle" and that the remediation plan violated her First Amendment right of speech and religion. The district court denied her request for a preliminary injunction, and the panel including Pryor upheld that denial. But Pryor wrote a concurring opinion to make clear that a university should not be able to take adverse action against a student "based on the concern that the student might, in a variety of [non-university] circum-

State Supreme Court judges


The remaining five judges on Trump's potential U.S. Supreme Court nominee list are members of state supreme courts. While their records on LGBT issues are sparse, they are also less likely to be considered qualified and experienced enough on federal court issues to be nominated to the nation's highest federal court. They include:

• Don Willett of the Texas Supreme Court, 49,

who worked in the administration of President George W. Bush as a policy adviser in the Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives. He also worked for a conservative think tank, the Texas Public Policy Foundation, and served as deputy attorney general under then-Texas Attorney General (now governor) Greg Abbott. He was appointed to his current position by former Gov. Rick Perry. He is best known for mocking the U.S. Supreme Court's deliberation of marriage equality by posting a Twitter message, "I could support recognizing a constitutional right to marry bacon."

- Thomas Lee of the Utah Supreme Court, 51, who clerked for U.S. Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas and conservative 4th Circuit Judge J. Harvie Wilkinson III.
- Allison Eid of the Colorado Supreme Court, 50, also clerked for Clarence Thomas.
- **David Stras** of the Minnesota Supreme Court, 41, also clerked for Clarence Thomas.
- Joan Larsen of the Michigan Supreme Court, 47, clerked for Justice Antonin Scalia and for conservative federal appeals court Judge David Sentelle of the D.C. Circuit.

The **Shock**ing truth about HRC

he Human Rights Campaign represents a force of more than 1.5 million members and supporters nationwide. As the largest national lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender civil rights organization, HRC says it envisions a world where LGBT people are ensured of their basic equal rights, and can be open, honest and safe at home, at work and in the community.

Sounds great. But what is HRC really all about?

Where do we begin to answer that question? How about we start right here at home, where HRC members are some of the most active people in the LGBT community. We are active politically, socially and philanthropically. You'll see HRC members serving on boards and committees for just about every LGBT group in North Texas.

You'll see HRC volunteers helping at Pride celebrations in Dallas and Fort Worth, as well as in places like Longview, Tyler and Texarkana. HRC members participate in events like the South Dallas AIDS Walk, LifeWalk, the Black Trans Advocacy Gala and Transgender Day of Remembrance.

As the national beneficiary for Black Tie Dinner, we also volunteer with the BTD to ensure we do our part in assisting with their extremely successful dinner.

We also bring in the folks from HRC National to help when needed. For example, when the city of Dallas was looking at ways to better serve

its LGBT community, the city council turned to HRC National to find out how to proactively make improvements and increase the city's score on the Municipal Equality Index (MEI).




HRC staff met with the council to help set tangi-

ble, meaningful goals for the city. Through the work of the city's LGBT Task Force and the tremendous support of the city council, the result was the explicit inclusion of non-discrimination protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity and expression in city codes governing employment, housing and public accommodation.

And, in 2015, Dallas earned the highest possible score of 100 in the MEI.

Fort Worth has also worked closely with HRC and in 2015 earned an MEI score of 99!

Helping cities treat all of their citizens with dignity, respect and legal protection is what HRC is all about.



As you know, right now in states across the country, anti-LGBT legislation is epidemic. There were a whopping 197 anti-LGBT bills introduced in 34 states this year. And while 114 (so far) of them have failed to pass, we still have laws that got through in North Carolina and Mississippi, and possible bills being enacted in Tennessee, Alabama, Missouri and other places.

HRC has been fighting these bills across the country. The Texas Legislature doesn't meet again until 2017. But the same Texas legislators who tried to pass anti-LGBT legislation in the 2015 session are watching what is going on around the country and planning how they are going to pass anti-LGBT laws here — laws that would allow anti-LGBT discrimination in the name of "Religious Freedom;" laws that would criminalize and put transgender people at risk just because they need to pee; laws that would override local anti-discrimination ordinances like the ones we have in Dallas and Fort Worth; and laws that would try to place limits on the gains we have made with marriage equality.

These threats are real and we need to be ready. In coalition with groups including Equality Texas, the ACLU of Texas, Lambda Legal, the Texas Freedom Network, the Transgender Education Network of Texas and others, HRC is getting ready to combat any of these efforts that

would legalize discrimination and put LGBT people in danger. Fighting bad legislation across the country and here in Texas is what HRC is all about.

In addition to all of this, HRC is a resource to help in many other areas, including programs to make schools more welcoming to LGBT kids and to end bullying; with ways to reach out to communities of faith to help them to become LGBT affirming; with adoption and parenting information for LGBT people; and with international outreach programs whose goals include ending the violence against LGBT people in many countries around the world.

Bringing equality and dignity to everyone is what HRC is all about.

So, what is the shocking truth about HRC? The shocking truth is that HRC and HRC's members are fighting for LGBT equality in more ways than anybody would imagine. We are proud of the work that we do and firmly believe the mission of HRC. And we are committed to continuing the fight until full LGBT equality is a reality. Please join us!

STAGE MINI REVIEWS: 'Ragtime,' 'Blackberry Winter'

Ragtime is one of the most impressive novels of the 1970s, one of the most underrated films of the 1980s and a fairly ambitious musical of the 1990s, winning an armful of Tony Awards in telling the sweep ing story of turn-of-the-century New York, where immigrants, prosperous blacks, Old Money whites and New Money entrepreneurs intersect in an explosion of culture, as expressed by the music of Scott Joplin.

You'll just have to trust me on this, however, as you can't tell much by what the audience heard on opening night. The sound system crackled and faded throughout, starting with the opening number and continuing throughout the performance, like Rice Crispies rattling around inside a leaf blower. Paying top dollar to miss a good portion of the dialogue and songs doesn't seem like a bargain, especially when you add to that a canned score (no live orchestra!), which stranded the non-Equity cast into going gamely forward no matter what.

You can't blame the actors for that, as they sing with powerful voices; some (notably Donald Coggin as Younger Brother and Matthew Curiano as Tateh) even stand out with strong acting performances. Alas, it feels for naught - even a tapestry of society can be pulled apart by a loose thread, leaving this Ragtime in rags.

Vivienne (Karen Parrish, pictured right) is a middle-aged woman coping with something most people of her age have to suffer through: the deterioration of a parent - in this case her mother to dementia. Despite a supportive husband and



well-intentioned siblings, most fo the stresses fall squarely on her, causing her bouts of insomnia, which she deals with by baking ... and occasionally creating a parable about Alzheimer's - senility-ascreation-myth, like Pandora releasing the demons of the society on the world.

Steve Yockey's rolling world premiere play Blackberry Winter - getting its debut here as part of Kitchen Dog's New Works Festival — is a sort of Aesop's fable within a monologue, ripe with tender confusion about the role of parent and child and heartbreak masked behind a sense of optimism. And most, if not all, of those conflicting emotions are conveyed in Parrish's poignant, raw dignity as Vivienne. It's perhaps because she's not "special," just a typical adult daughter, that her story resonates so deeply. If you haven't been there, you probably will be. If only we all could deal with it as creatively as Vivienne.





And I love helping people. I know, I am just as surprised as you are. But that's what we are here for. So


