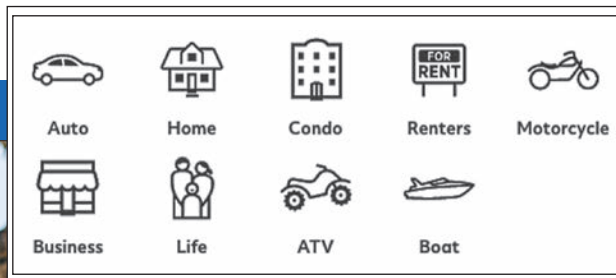

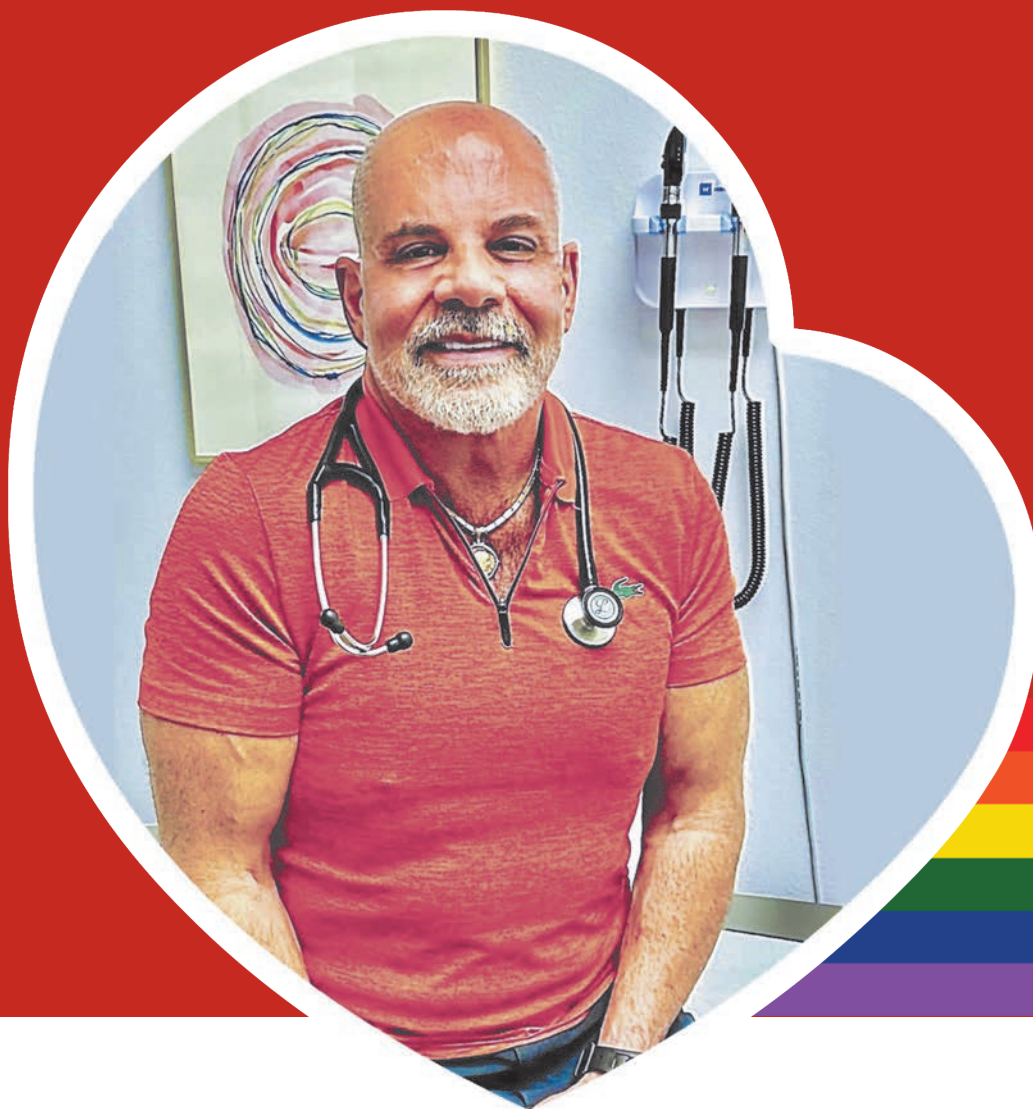

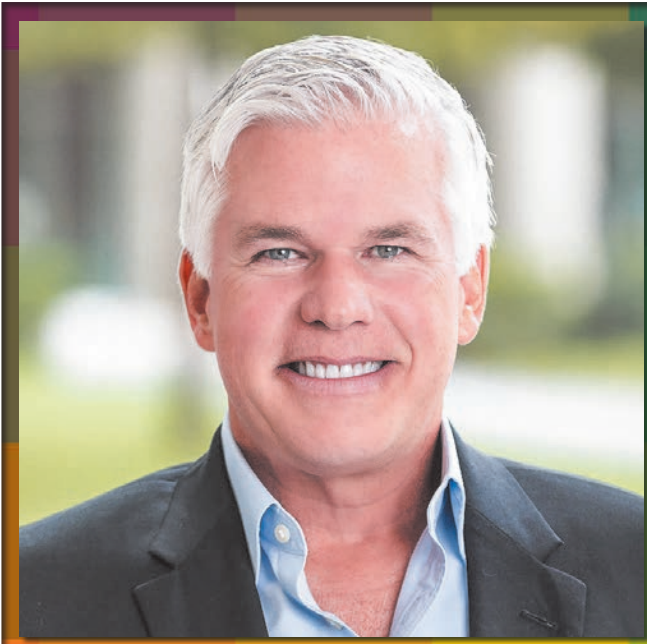

It's always a wonderful day in the Gayborhood

The LGBTQ community in North Texas is spread far and wide throughout the big cities of Dallas and Fort Worth as well as throughout the many suburbs. But if there's a heart to it all, it's Oak Lawn.

Oak Lawn is the neighborhood in Dallas where the community really staked its claim years ago. In the middle of that are the rainbow crossroads of Cedar Springs Road and Throckmorton Street. Here is where all the gay bars, queer-owned shops and inclusive restaurants continue to bring the community together.

Commonly known as The Strip, visitors can find a nexus of bars and clubs to whet the appetite for dancing and drinks. You can see in the bar guide on page 35 that queer bars dot the Oak Lawn landscape, but the most popular ones are found on Cedar Springs.

The Round-Up Saloon has been the happening spot for its country-western

fans, but it certainly isn't limited to line dances and two-steps. Drag shows, karaoke and that those times Lady Gaga visited have all helped to make it a famous destination spot for queer nightlife.

Across the street is the massive Station 4 (or S4) dance club under the Caven collective. A mecca for sick beats and circuit parties, the former Village Station still draws big crowds helped by its upstairs bar and its world-famous Rose Room cabaret venue where drag is king — or is that queen?

Other Caven spots include S4 neighbors TMC: The Mining Company and Sue Ellen's, the oldest lesbian bar in the country.

Other clubs on The Strip include Mr. Misster, Lava Lounge, Alexandre's, Havana, Woody's Dallas and restaurant/bar Roy G's.

Visitors looking for a bite can sample all sorts of flavors and foods. The center of it all is the iconic, queer-owned

establishment Hunky's, the throwback diner with hefty burgers and cherry sodas.

Tacos y Mas, Thai Lotus, Taqueria La Ventana, Ai Sushi Sake Grill and Mario's all bring some cultural tastes to The Strip.

Grab a slice or even a whole pie at Italia Express or Zio Al's. For some morning fare, try brunch at Roy G's or coffee at Crickle's and Co. A little off The Strip but down Cedar Springs is Union, the queer forward coffee shop on the campus of Oak Lawn United Methodist Church, which stands guard on the corner of Oak Lawn and Cedar Springs with its historic building.

Tapelenders was the Strip's oldest retail store, starting out as a video rental place and now pivoted to gift items, gear and more. The shop rebranded on 2023 into Package Dallas featuring gear, upscale undies, sexy swimwear and more.

Go vintage at Out of the Closet, a

thrift store where profits benefit AIDS Healthcare Foundation.

For some more flirty wear and daring outfits (OK, if you wanna show some skin), try Skivvies and Outlines for clothing and undergarments with that extra touch.

Recently, The Strip added the popular

Hamburger Mary's complete with its famous drag brunch. And Caven just opened a new concept bar with Cheat Code, a gaming speakeasy lounge.

At the head of the block is the Legacy of Love monument on Oak Lawn Avenue at Cedar Springs.

Many of Oak Lawn's older apartments

and housing have been cleared for newer buildings, but the character is still present with pockets of the old neighborhood next to more recent construction. Oak Lawn perseveres with past, present and future vibes that remain the hub of queer North Texas.

SIGHTS AND ATTRACTIONS

Check these off your North Texas bucket list



o you made it to North Texas — now what? That is entirely up to you, but filling the days with sightseeing and area

destinations will be an easy task. Much of the sights and attractions are full of Texas lore, whether it's from the old western days or modern architectural wonders. That mix of old and new gives North Texas its textural feel of variety. As the saying goes, there is something for everyone.

These highlights show the diversity that North Texas has to offer. The sheer number of attractions and experiences may just keep you coming back to the area quite often.

AT&T Stadium

Sports fans or not, head to Arlington to see the most expensive sports venue ever built, which is also the home of the Dallas Cowboys. The structure isn't just home to football, but also big name concerts like Taylor Swift and Beyonce

in the last year alone. If you're there for a game, then no seat is bad thanks to its 1080p HD video display which at 25,000 square feet, is one of the largest boards in the world.

Minus the event, the venue is a wonder in itself and open to tours every day. Almost a museum of sorts, the venue contains a curated collection of art, phenomenal architecture and of course, the football field itself. ATTStadium.com.

Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens

Located on White Rock Lake, this attraction is popular throughout the year with both visitors and residents. On almost 70 acres is a magnificent display of green and colorful flora peppered with stunning structures and mini-gardens within the gardens. Annual events and educational programs happen throughout each season. Open year round. DallasArboretum.org.

Dallas Farmers Market

Established in 1941, this is one of the largest public markets that goes beyond the idea of a basic market. Restaurants, shops and, of course, all the foods, seasonal produce and handcrafted items for sale in The Shed all make up this extensive downtown market. Open daily. DallasFarmersMarket.org.

Dallas Heritage Village

Step back in time at this historic center in Old City Park. The village is home to the largest collection of 19th century pioneer and Victorian homes in Texas. These buildings have been relocated from throughout Texas to Dallas' first city park. Open year round. DallasHeritageVillage.org.

Dallas World Aquarium

This marks the 20th year of this downtown destination by the West End. The aquarium features a variety of marine life from small to large, such as jellyfish, sharks and seadragons. Begin

at the rainforest side to see toucans and sloths and exotic birds. Conservation efforts work to help endangered animals at the venue such as manatees, crocodiles and monkeys. DWAZoo.com.

Dallas Zoo

What's crazy to think about this attraction is that it was founded in 1888 with just a couple of deer and mountain lions. What? Now, the nonprofit zoo welcomes more than one million guests over 364 days each year.

Located three miles south of downtown Dallas, the 106-acre Dallas Zoo is the oldest and largest zoo in Texas and is home to more than 2,000 animals representing over 400 species. DallasZoo.com.

Deep Ellum

Austin may be the live music capital of Texas, but North Texas has its own in this eclectic neighborhood just east of downtown Dallas. But it's not just about the music here at venues such as Trees, Dada, Canton Hall or Adair's Saloon. Dining and drink options feel endless at the numerous bars such as Deep Ellum Brewery or Thunderbird Station and gamut-running restaurants like the comfort food of Allgood Cafe, major slices at Serious Pizza or the always-popular Pecan Lodge barbecue. DeepEllumTexas.com.

Fair Park

This iconic park east of downtown Dallas is home to a number of entertainment venues, art deco features and special events throughout the year, most notably the annual State Fair of Texas in October. The grounds include the African American Museum, the DAR House and Texas Discovery Gardens. The Esplanade is a grand landscape of art deco features, and walkways throughout the park make, for many photo opportunities and a commune with its deep Dallas history. FairPark.org.

Fort Worth Stockyards

The Stockyards National Historic District is the real deal. Home to cowboys and cattlemen of days past, the Stockyards deliver a true taste of the American West with its brick streets, saloons and historic buildings and storefronts. The streets come alive when the Fort Worth Herd cattle drive hits the streets twice a day. Visitors can experience Mule Alley featuring a number of shops with authentic western apparel at Maverick or Lucchese Bootmaker; restaurants for dining Texas-style include Lonesome Dove Western Bistro or Cattlemen's Steak House; find music and dancing at Billy Bob's or Whiskey Girl Saloon. Grab a dose of cowboy history at the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame while you're at it. FortWorth.com.

Fort Worth Water Gardens

Designed by queer architect Philip Johnson, this downtown attraction features a multitude of water features in an urban environment. The park contains three different pools — the aerating pool, the quiet pool and the active pool. Open year round. FortWorth.com.

Fort Worth Zoo

This zoo features more than 7,000 native and exotic animals along with a number of indoor and outdoor exhibits. Within the zoo, guests can get close to animals at the petting zoo, learn about the wildlife of Texas and visit four different types of apes in their 2.5-acre sanctuary. The zoo is currently in the midst of construction projects and renovations that have some animals off exhibit. Along with its many visitor attractions, the zoo also hosts several camps for area students and youths and volunteer opportunities for all. FortWorthZoo.org.

George W. Bush Presidential Center

OK, we know. For a lot of folks, W. isn't a fave. But, minus all that, Dallas is home to the nation's 13th presidential library at Southern Methodist University's campus. The library features a high-def video wall, a replica of the Oval Office and more than 40,000 artifacts in total. Exhibitions display steel from the World Trade Center, letters following the 9/11 attacks and photographs and electronic records of the Bush presidency. Regardless of politics, the center itself is an impressive note among Dallas attractions. GeorgeWBushLibrary.gov.

Mandalay Canals

You may not expect gondola rides in North Texas, but Irving delivers this scenic attraction. The canals are part of the Las Colinas Urban Center which connects to Lake Carolyn. The canals offer views of waterfalls, bridges and more, winding through the center restaurants, shops and hotels. Gondolas aren't the only vehicles on the water. Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge

Designed by renowned architect Santiago Calatrava, the bridge connects downtown to West Dallas, which includes new dining destination collectives Trinity Groves and Sylvan 30. The walkable bridge gives stunning views of downtown, the bridge and the Trinity River — even moreso at night. Trails below the bridge are prime for biking and running, featuring upclose glimpses of Dallas nature and wetlands. TrinityRiverCorridor.com.

Ripley's Believe it or Not!/Louis Tussaud's Waxworks

Head to Grand Prairie for a dose of strange. Ripley's Believe It or Not! Odditorium features the fascinating and bizarre in its galleries of objects and displays from around the world. Try not to get too lost in the Enchanted Mirror Maze. The attraction now features its new 7D moving theater. Under the same roof, meet Lady Gaga and Beyonce — the wax versions — and other celebrities in Tussaud's. Superheroes, historical figures and more are among the lifelike replicas throughout the wax palace. Ripleys.com.

Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza

President John F. Kennedy still holds a fascination for many as does the site of his assassination. This museum brings all that together nearby the place it all happened. Located within the former Texas School Book Depository building, the museum chronicles the assassination and legacy of the 35th president. JFK.org.

Southfork Ranch

Fans of the show *Dallas* can get a closer look at the Ewing Family home in Parker. The ranch features year-round guided tours and memorabilia from the show, including Lucy's wedding dress, Jock Ewing's Lincoln and the gun that shot J.R. Guests can stroll the grounds and outlying buildings on their own or book a trail ride or horse riding lesson. SouthforkRanch.com.

The Mustangs of Las Colinas

Nine bronze mustangs galloping over water is a remarkable attraction in Irving. The larger than life public art is part of the Las Colinas Urban Center at Williams Square. The accompanying museum however is temporarily closed. IrvingArchivesandMuseum.com.

Reunion Tower

Thanks to "The Ball" with almost 300 exterior LED lights, the Dallas skyline has been easily identifiable since 1978. Head up the 470 feet up to experience 360-degree panoramic views of Dallas and beyond, a free digital photo and an indoor/outdoor observation deck that lets you see for miles in any direction. ReunionTower.com.

Six Flags Over Texas /Hurricane Harbor

Amusement park lovers can find more than 40 rides along with shows, food and more at this attraction in Arlington, located smack in the middle between Dallas and Fort Worth. The park's newest roller coaster —El Diablo — is its 14th. Six Flags Over Texas has a calendar of events throughout the year that is often filled with festivals, performances and more. The park also gets seasonal big time with Spring Break Out, summer's Fourth of July, Fright Fest in the fall and Holiday in the Park.

Across the highway, the heat can be beat at Six Flags Hurricane Harbor water park. Thrill rides like the 72 feet-tall Der Stuka water slide, the seven-story high Geronimo and the multi-lane Wahoo Racer welcome, all challengers. For less thrills and more chill, the park also offers the Suntan Lagoon and the relaxing Lazy River Cruise. SixFlags.com.

Sundance Square

This downtown Fort Worth district is a hub for shopping, dining and entertainment. The plaza is its centerpiece with grand fountains and murals, but Bass Performance Hall rivals it for attention with its magnificent facade. There is much to do in this walker-friendly district, from upscale dining to bar hopping and family-friendly excursions. SundanceSquare.com.

Texas Live!

This all-in-one attraction is certainly ideal for sports fans, but there is plenty for non-sports fans, too. The massive venue brings entertainment, dining and even accommodations all into one place.

Located in Arlington, Texas Live! is nestled among the three large sports venues, so if pre-gaming is your thing, try it here. But any day, one can ride one of two mechanical bulls at PBR Texas, catch a concert at CBD Kratom Backyard, get a mouthful of meats at Lockhart Smokehouse or dine and drink at Troy's owned by Dallas Cowboy legend Troy Aikman.

TAKE A QUICK TRIP

For a change of scenery, North Texas' highways can get you out (and back in) with ease. Go west — or north, south or east — to find some quaint towns, natural landscapes or local entertainment that leave a lasting impression. Just fill 'er up and hit the road to these select day trips.

THE ROSE CAPITAL OF AMERICA is right here in Texas. Tyler is the largest city in northeast Texas, and roses are a big deal there. Just shy of 100 miles southeast of Dallas, the city makes for a worthwhile trip to its Tyler Municipal Rose Garden, featuring 14 acres, thousands of rose bushes and more than 300 varieties of roses and 600 beds. The Tyler Rose Museum adds to the flowery ambience, but don't skip the Tyler Museum, the state park or its gorgeous historic districts. VisitTyler.com.

THE SMALL TOWN OF PARIS has a population of 25,000 but is overloaded with charm. The historic downtown is just one of 17 historic districts that show off its deep Texas roots. Plus, you can always say you went to Paris. The city is also the hometown of recent Out North Texas' cover celeb and drag superstar Shangela. VisitParis-Tx.com.

WACO is about 100 miles south of Dallas and is famous not only for Baylor University but for the Magnolia Market at the Silos, founded by HGTV *Fixer Upper* stars Chip and Joanna Gaines. Magnolia.com.

LAKE MINERAL WELLS STATE PARK AND TRAILWAY is less than an hour away. Head west through Fort Worth for this state park that's in the middle of cattle country. The Texas Parks and Wildlife spot features a lake, a rock climbing area and miles of trails. TPWD.Texas.gov.

DENTON is the home of the University of Texas in North Texas but also home to several live music venues that feature both local bands and touring artists. Dan's Silverleaf, Rubber Gloves and Andy's Bar and Grill are just some of the venues worth the roughly 37 mile drive north. DiscoverDenton.com.

DINOSAUR VALLEY STATE PARK is 90 miles southwest of Dallas/Fort Worth in Glen Rose. Go here to see where the dinosaurs once roamed the Lone Star State. Fossil Rim Wildlife Center. Is also located in the town. TPWD.Texas.gov. FossilRim.org.

FIRST MONDAY CANTON about 60 miles east of Dallas is touted as the world's largest flea market. The monthly event is held every weekend the first Monday falls on. Get your cash ready for vintage finds, shabby chic and probably anything else you can think of. FirstMondayCanton.com.

GRAPEVINE VINTAGE RAILROAD, located 36 miles northwest of Dallas in the small town of Grapevine is a literal trip back in time. Stick around the town for its many wineries and delightful shops. GrapevineTexasUSA.com.

LAKE TEXOMA is a straight shot up the North Dallas Tollway. Drive 85 miles to enjoy the popular outdoor destination for fishing, hiking and some big time history. LakeTexomaOnline.com.

About 72 miles southwest of Dallas is **GRANBURY**. The appeal is its historic parts, natch, but if shopping is more your thing, then ready yourself for a load of shops and boutiques for unique gifts for friends, family and hopefully yourself. Commune with nature at the Acton Nature Center or tee off at its numerous golf courses. Granbury may be small but packs a big, surprising punch. VisitGranbury.com.

ENNIS is about 35 miles south of Dallas, and, come springtime, this is the place to go for all your bluebonnet photos. Just don't pick them. That's against the law, since it's the state flower and all. BluebonnetTrail.org.

GREENVILLE lives up to its name with its lush green landscape marking the beginning of the East Texas region. About 50 miles east of Dallas is this city that features both natural attractions and small city delights. Lake Tawakoni State Park is prime for fishing enthusiasts but also features a swim beach, trails and campsites. Taste some grape at Landon Winery, and catch a show at the newly refurbished Texan Theater. CI.Greenville.Tx.US.

SAN MARCOS is due south on I-35 past Austin. About 236 miles from Dallas, this is a longer trip, but shopping at its outlet malls may be worth it. San Marcos Premium Outlets is much like any other outlet mall — but on steroids. VisitSanMarcos.com.

Meow Wolf sets up residence in North Texas

The much-anticipated Grapevine Meow Wolf opened in summer 2023 as the fourth location of the art collective. With locations in Denver, Las Vegas and, the original, in Santa Fe, Meow Wolf: The Real Unreal now calls Grapevine home. And for this iteration — The Real Unreal — opens portals into colorful explosions that are whimsical, dramatic, inventive and stimulating — all within the walls of Grapevine Mills shopping mall.

Meow Wolf describes The Real Unreal: “Participants will embark on a journey through a technicolor wonderland that blends storytelling, technology and immersive art. The experience encourages visitors to explore different dimensions of perspective and creativity through more than 30-plus rooms of multidimensional art and compelling narrative.”

Each Meow Wolf location has a story inviting participants to begin a journey which starts in a familiar space. In The Real Unreal, it’s a family home, and writer LaShawn Wanak has given this Meow Wolf a refreshing take on the story of a boy who goes missing into a portal he accidentally opened and the parents who are searching for him.

Through secret doors and interdimensional appliances, the experience transforms a suburban household into something else altogether.

“Meow Wolf seeks to open portals of possibilities and transport people to realms they have never seen before,” CEO Jose Tolosa said upon its opening.

The bonus to this Meow Wolf is the fabulous queer realms that exist in The Real Unreal!

Wanak’s story centers on two women (the parents who go searching) who cohabitate with their son (the boy who goes missing) and on the house they live in, a life-size set in which visitors walking through see the family’s Pride on clear display thanks to rainbow bags and slippers, photos and more items placed throughout the interiors.

“Thank you for noticing that,” Wanak said, expressing excitement about the queer elements in her story.

As she told Meow Wolf’s blog, The Blob, she hopes people will be comforted by what they take away from the experience.

“I want their first impression to be

‘Oh, this is a well-loved place, and the people inside love each other and care for each other.’ I’m hoping that people will get that sense as they move about, and that as they see [different] parts they’ll think, ‘Oh, they’re living their lives, and they’re living their best lives, too. They’re right where they want to be. At least a few of them are doing the stuff that they’ve always wanted to do, and they’re having a blast.’

“That’s what I want them to see,” Wanak said of her hopes for visitors to The Real Unreal, “that [the characters] care for each other, and they will walk with each other as they figure stuff out.”

Local LGBTQ artist Will Herron is among the 38 Texas artists whose works and installations are featured throughout the space. Stay tuned to Dallas Voice for more on the queer artists featured at Meow Wolf.

The queer charisma of Meow Wolf sends a welcoming signal to the community, but there is so much more to the entire experience.

Meow Wolf brought together some 150 artists and fabricators who created 70 experiences ranging from immersive murals to three-dimensional sculptures and creatures to video games and just about any and everything else that could be imagined. Among the artists found in The Real Unreal are Dan Lam, Emmanuelle John, Mariell Guzman, Lance McGoldrick, XaLaVier Nelson Jr., Riley Holloway and Nico Salazar.

This location also honors Matt King, one of the original founders of Meow Wolf, who was born in Dallas and who passed away in June 2022. This location obviously has special ties to him.

“We really wanted this space to honor Matt,” Benji Geary said of the Neon Kingdom within The Real Unreal. Flowers from King’s service and other touches that speak to King’s tastes are among the elements included in the huge psychedelic space that envelopes the visitor in neon (LED) lights and a glow-in-the-dark spectrum of colors.

So what to expect on your visit to Meow Wolf? You will certainly get your FitBit steps in. Plan to spend hours in Meow Wolf soaking up the experience through a number of vibes, interactions and visuals.

All guests will enter through the pink gates and metal detectors to step directly into the gift shop, which is as equally curated as the rest of

the experience, not just with Meow Wolf attire and gifts, but with artistic intention by creative director Dani Herrera.

“We wanted the experience to begin immediately,” she said. The aesthetic of the gift shop is colorful and cool with reflective, metallic mannequins keeping eyes on the whole store.

There are lockers and guest services available also at the front of the house.

Murals that depict the stories of transformation and Texas then guide visitors toward Meow Wolf’s curated café, which is “an extension of the immersive art world that is Meow Wolf Grapevine,” said Mandy Cooper, director of operations. “Our goal is to provide economic opportunity that supports local-, women- and minority-owned small businesses. We have partnered with more than 15 local food and beverage artists to bring their flavors to Meow Wolf Grapevine.

“If you taste something you like, you can visit and support these businesses right here in the Dallas-Fort Worth area.”

Food and beverage vendors featured in Meow Wolf’s cafe include drinks by Celestial Beerworks, Juiceland, Celzo Co (agua frescas), teas by HTeaO and Purpose and coffees by Noble Coyote and Peaberry.

The menu includes tastes from All Y’all’s Food, Blended Family Foods, Del Campo Empanadas, GNS Foods and Nikki’s Popcorn Company. Sweet bites are provided by Melt Ice Cream, Judy Pie, Macarons by Mac and Cream, Hive Bakery and Buzzed Bull Creamery.

You’ll need the sustenance to manage walking throughout the multi-story venue with its endless rooms, hidden walkways, crawl spaces and secret doors. Designers did consider that and worked in seating throughout the space where you can pause and sit to catch your breath.

Neither food nor drinks nor strollers are allowed into The Real Unreal, however Meow Wolf is ADA compliant.

With all that in mind, get ready for Meow Wolf to be a mind-blowing experience — one that no one could fully describe but that I do highly recommend. MeowWolf.com/Visit/Grapevine.

Julie Johnson is running for congress



"Experience counts," Texas state Rep. Julie Johnson has said to explain what sets her apart from other candidates in the race to replace Congressman Colin Allred, the Texas Democrat who chose to challenge Ted Cruz for his seat in the U.S. Senate rather than running for re-election to the Texas District 32 seat in Congress.

Johnson was referring to her experience in having run several successful campaigns, having successfully raised the money needed to win a competitive race and having served in elective office.

Johnson just finished her third term in the Texas Legislature. Only one of her opponents in the race to replace Allred has run for office before, and that candidate served just one term before losing his re-election bid.

Johnson first took office after challenging and defeating state Rep. Matt Rinaldi, author of an anti-transgender bathroom bill that never passed in the Texas House. Like her opponent, Johnson was interested in what went on in Texas schools, but rather than concentrate on the bathroom, she focused on the classroom. That earned her the endorsement of school officials across her Northwest Dallas County district.

During her first week in office, Johnson, along with four other out women in the Texas House of Representatives, formed the first LGBT Caucus in Texas. Together, the caucus has rallied allies and has killed hundreds of bills attacking the LGBTQ community during its three sessions in existence. And in her three terms in the Texas House, Johnson has gained a reputation of listening to her constituents, working across the aisle and getting legislation passed.

For example, Johnson was trying to pass a bill about reauthorization of HIV medications. She spoke to some of her Republican colleagues about the issue. Generally they were in favor of the idea of reauthorizing medication just once a year, rather than quarterly, but they preferred not to vote for AIDS legislation. So, after listening to her Republican colleagues, Johnson removed "AIDS" from the bill's wording and included all medications for diseases related to immune disorders.

The bill passed, and the final version actually helps more patients than she originally intended.

Johnson said she was proud of that





legislation because, "It's going to help people stay on their meds."

"There are so many barriers to care," she continued. "When somebody you love is in an acute healthcare crisis, there's nothing more important to you than getting healthcare."

LGBTQ issues are just as important to Johnson as education and healthcare.

The trans healthcare ban that passed in the 2023 Legislature has made it illegal to provide gender-affirming healthcare to trans people under the age of 18. That, to Johnson, is unacceptable.

"Did we ever envision a time, say 15 years ago, when the government would say, 'We know more than parents do about healthcare for your kids?'" she asked. "Did we ever see that coming? It's unconscionable the way the far right has inserted themselves into the doctor-parent relationship."

One healthcare goal Johnson wasn't able to achieve during her tenure in the Texas Legislature was Medicaid expansion. But, she said, as a member of Congress she would push to expand the program across the country, forcing states like Texas to cover more their residents.

She noted that Texas is losing \$8 billion by refusing to expand the program, adding, "It's irresponsible. It would provide an \$8 billion budget surplus."

And while education is one of the issues that propelled Johnson into office, fighting vouchers became her passion during the record number of special sessions called by the governor last year. Johnson joined a coalition of Democrats and rural Republicans who believe diverting money to private schools would hurt funding for public education.

Rural areas, mostly represented by Republicans, don't have private schools where they can use vouchers, so a plan that diverts money from public schools will hurt them. Those areas strongly support their public schools and their schools' football teams. So taking money away from public education is very unpopular in rural areas of the state, Johnson said.

Johnson has never shied away from discussing her sexual orientation and LGBTQ rights. She's married to Dr. Sue Moster, a gastroenterologist who practices in Southlake, and they have two sons, ages 20 and 23.

Johnson was the first LGBTQ

representative in Texas with a spouse, and Moster became a proud member of the Legislative Ladies, a group for spouses of Texas representatives and senators. In her three terms as a member of the spousal group, Moster made such a good impression that the other members asked her to be president of the group next legislative session. So now Moster is a little disappointed her wife won't be back in Austin next session.

Johnson has said she decided to run for Congress when "several people reached out to me," and that she is well aware of what electing a lesbian would "symbolize for our community," especially in a state that she called "the epicenter of anti-LGBT legislation."

Johnson knows she'll face a number of opponents in the Democratic Primary, but she said that of those who've announced they plan to run, she's the only one who's ever won an election.

And her experience counts.

"There's a reason so many members of Congress come from their state legislatures," she said. "Experience matters."

ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT

Curtain calls

Arts and culture are big deals in North Texas. Theater, live music, comedy, dance — they are all here happening somewhere at sometime.

With their appeal and talent combined, the companies and arts organizations in North Texas are assets to the area that contribute to Dallas/Fort Worth's cultural appeal.

Theaters are home to queer-centric companies like Uptown Players and blockbuster Broadway tours. Concerts can happen at venues that fit 100 up to 80,000. Visual arts range from local galleries committed to area artists and museums that feature all the masters.

First, we look at the two largest districts that have become key to making North Texas not only a destination for visitors and audiences, but for talent as well.

THE DALLAS ARTS DISTRICT

This area is home to the key arts groups of Dallas as well as the Booker T. Washington School for the Performing and Visual Arts. The district is nestled along the Woodall Rodgers Freeway, and is primarily bordered by Ross Avenue and St Paul Street. The AT&T Performing Arts Center is a nonprofit that oversees the district and programming across the performance venues and parks.

While the Dallas Arts District is a distinct campus of locations, included here are the nearby venues for visual arts that includes the city's primary museums. DallasArtsDistrict.org and ATTPAC.org.

ANNETTE STRAUSS SQUARE is an open-air entertainment venue with a 2,000-seat capacity with lawn and patio seating. The venue has hosted concerts, theater and even drag queens on its stage to audiences surrounded by downtown Dallas skyscrapers. ATTPAC.org.

Founded in 1998, the **CROW MUSEUM OF ASIAN ART** of the University of Texas at Dallas is a free museum that showcases the arts and cultures of Asia both ancient and modern. *Japan, Form & Function: The Montgomery Collection* is open through April. CrowCollection.org.

THE DALLAS MUSEUM OF ART (DMA) is among the 10 largest art museums in the country and was founded in 1903. Since 1984, the museum has been in its current location, which makes it the first arts organization of the Dallas Arts District. The DMA collection spans more than 5,000 years and includes holdings from ancient times to modern day. The recent exhibition *Abraham Ángel: Between Wonder and Seduction*, the first major survey of the Mexican queer artist in 35 years, was on display through the end of January. *Love Island: Japanese Weddings of the Edo Period* opened in late 2023 and runs through this October. Marking the 150-year

anniversary of the first Impressionist exhibition of 1874, *The Impressionist Revolution from Monet to Matisse* opens in February through November. DMA.org.

THE DALLAS SYMPHONY

ORCHESTRA performs its seasons of pops, classical and family concerts in the McDermott Concert Hall at the Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center, designed by architect I.M. Pei, and more commonly known as The Meyerson. DallasSymphony.org.

THE DALLAS THEATER CENTER is a major regional theater and presents its main stage season at the Wyly Theatre in the Arts District. The venue, designed by Joshua Prince-Ramus and Pritzker Prize-winning architect Rem Koolhaas, can be configured in multiple ways to suit the show. Under the leadership of gay Artistic Director Kevin Moriarty, DTC produces a mix of contemporary, classic and musical pieces throughout its season. DTC also received the 2017 Tony Award for Best Regional Theater. Remaining shows for its 2023/24 season include the Black queer-themed *I Am Delivered* and closes with the Disney musical *The Little Mermaid*. DallasTheaterCenter.com.

THE MOODY PERFORMANCE HALL hosts multi-disciplinary performances by area companies such as Bruce Wood Dance Project, the Dallas Chamber Symphony, and The Women's Chorus of Dallas, but the space's focus has leaned toward dance hosting performances by Avant Chamber Ballet, Pegasus Contemporary Ballet and TITAS/DANCE UNBOUND. ATTPAC.org

THE NASHER SCULPTURE CENTER features a strong collection of contemporary and modern sculptures with works by de Kooning, Giacometti, Matisse, Rodin and more. The center features both indoor and outdoor views of its collection and is host to a variety of events including music, screenings and culinary events. NasherSculptureCenter.org.

For the past decade, the **PEROT MUSEUM OF NATURE AND SCIENCE**, located in Victory Park near the district,

has grown into a destination for all ages. With almost a dozen halls for exhibition space, the museum offers permanent displays of prehistoric animals, weather characteristics, robots and more with its extensive staircase that overlooks the city. The Perot's current exhibit, *T. rex: The Ultimate Predator*, is open through September. PerotMuseum.org.

With its red glass facade, the **WINSPEAR OPERA HOUSE** is a modern take on a classic idea. It has 2,200 seats and the Hamon Hall space and is home to The Dallas Opera, Texas Ballet Theater, TITAS/DANCE UNBOUND and the AT&T Performing Arts Center Broadway Series. The Moody Foundation chandelier is a modernist highlight upon seating. ATTPAC.org.

THE FORT WORTH CULTURAL DISTRICT

This massive district is practically considered a neighborhood in Fort Worth. Boasting world-class museums, an iconic stage and more, the area just lies just west of all the bustling downtown goings-on in Cowtown. All of Fort Worth's cultural offerings aren't far from this district such as Stage West, Circle Theater, Bass Hall or the Botanic Gardens, but its museum district is legendary.

AMON CARTER MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART gives space to the American masters that highlight the American and Western experience. Designed by gay architect Philip Johnson, the museum is currently featuring *Re/Framed* which gives guests a new way to look at the Carter's collection on view through March, and the outdoor sculpture exhibition, *The Tipping Point: Echoes of Extinction* by artist Elizabeth Turk through May. CarterMuseum.org.

Recognizable by its signature dome, **CASA MAÑANA THEATRE** is one of the largest performing arts organizations in Tarrant County. The theater has brought a variety of musical productions to Fort Worth since 1936. This year's season includes *Once in*

March, *Grease* in June and in August, the musical *Pippin*. CasaManana.org.

KIMBELL ART MUSEUM is a world-renowned treasure in Fort Worth that begins on the outside with its buildings designed by Louis Khan and Renzo Piano. The museum perpetuates its reputation inside with its special exhibitions and permanent collection. The museum celebrated its 50th year in 2023. For 2024, the Kimbell will feature *Art and War in the Renaissance: The Battle of Pavia Tapestries* opening June followed by *Dutch Art in a Global Age: Masterpieces from the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston* this November. KimbellArt.org.

THE MODERN ART MUSEUM OF FORT WORTH, or The Modern, showcases art from the 1940s to now in the heart of the city's Fort Worth museum district. The glass and steel Brutalist building by Tadao Ando alone is a site with its reflecting pool and sleek interiors. This year, the museum opens *Surrealism and Us: Caribbean and African Diasporic Artists since 1940* in March it runs through July. TheModern.org.

Get a deep dive into women of the West by exploring the **NATIONAL COWGIRL MUSEUM AND HALL OF FAME**. The museum honors the women who created their own stories in the Wild West portraits, histories and state-of-the-art holograms. Upcoming exhibitions include the multi-gallery exhibition *Soldaderas to Amazonas: Escaramuzas Charras* in March. Cowgirl.net.

ARTSPACE111 in downtown Fort Worth showcases contemporary Texas art in an historic 1911 building. The gallery features year-round solo and group exhibitions working to make contemporary art accessible to everyone. Artspace111.com.

The gay-owned **CRAIGHEAD GREEN GALLERY** in the Dallas Design District has represented national and international contemporary artists since 1992. Representing more than 50 artists, the gallery gives its focus to paintings, prints and sculpture while supporting local emerging artists with its New Texas Talent exhibition. CraigheadGreen.com

DAISHA BOARD GALLERY is a newer art space on the scene that represents BIPOC and LGBTQIA artists and artists with disabilities in Dallas. Located at Trinity Groves in West Dallas, its inclusive mission is to provide visibility for marginalized artists and exhibitions are presented in a variety of media both traditional and non. The Design District's **HOLLY JOHNSON GALLERY** was founded in 2005 and highlights contemporary artists on its walls. The gallery hosts eight exhibitions, often focusing on a single artist. KETTLE ART GALLERY in Deep Ellum just outside of downtown Dallas gives strong focus to local artists led by artist

MAESTRI GALLERY is queer-owned and curates artists with a focus on affordable contemporary pieces in Exposition Park in Dallas. MaestriGallery.com.

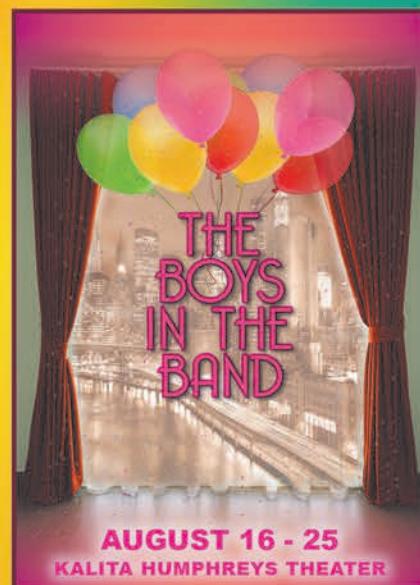
MUSEUMS/CULTURAL CENTERS

THE CLIBURN's mission is to advance classical piano music, and it does just that with its international competition and concert series in Fort Worth. Named from the famed gay concert pianist Van Cliburn, the organization and its performances call both Bass Hall and Texas Christian University its homes. The Van Cliburn Competition is held every four years, timed with the year of presidential inaugurations, and is thus next slated for 2025. THE DALLAS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA is the city's premiere music arts organization, delivering a huge season of concerts primarily at the Meyerson Symphony Center in the Dallas Arts District. The orchestra

The Joule mixes old and new with its modern spirit inside a neo-Gothic landmark building. With 160 rooms, the luxury hotel is more of a resort with all the amenities, featuring distinct retail options like the Taschen Library and Forty Five Ten, the acclaimed restaurants

CBD Provisions and Sassetta as well as Weekend Coffee.

Two things are a must at The Joule: The Spa and the Midnight Rambler Bar. The Spa is basically heaven on earth with its European heat treatments, high-end skincare and restorative body rituals as well as a shop of quality skin care products. 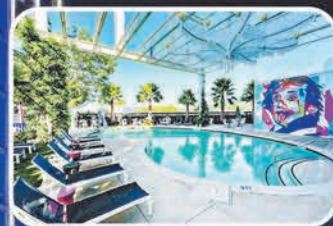

Where Cajun Spice Meets Texas Hospitality

The good times roll in the Bishop Arts District at lesbian owned-and-operated Restaurant Beatrice

n escape to New Orleans always delivers wild and memorable vacations, thanks to spectacular cuisine, iconic cocktails, and the friendly, welcoming vibe for LGBTQ people. But it's something most of us can't indulge in more than once or twice a year. Thankfully, Restaurant Beatrice in the heart of the culturally-rich Bishop Arts District can satisfy our desires for all things Cajun and Creole whenever we get a craving.

Owned and operated by out chef Michelle Carpenter, also the chef/owner of nearby Zen Sushi, Restaurant Beatrice delivers a dining experience that honors Louisiana's food history, as well as Carpenter's family traditions.

The restaurant name pays tribute to her father's mother, who was Cajun.

"I am half Japanese and half Cajun. My first restaurant, Zen Sushi, paid homage to my mother's side," Carpenter says. "Beatrice was a way for me to fulfill the other part of my identity and how I grew up: with homemade gumbo on the stove, crawfish boils on the patio and scratch-made Japanese cuisine in between."

Choosing the Bishop Arts District as a location for her two restaurant concepts represented a perfect fit for everything she wanted to achieve as a restaurateur and consummate host.

"It's one of the most diverse, accepting neighborhoods in the country," she says. "You see BIPOC and LGBTQ folks integrated here. This is a vibrant community where people are meaningfully engaged in what happens to their neighbors. People here care. I feel at home here, because my identity isn't considered an anomaly."

Of course, the food and drinks really

showcase the breadth of Carpenter's many talents. Providing fine dining with the pretense — focused on heirloom recipes from her family — she and her team focus on low-waste, sustainable operations that ring true to how her homesteading grandmother raised her Cajun family.

The menu features numerous staples of Louisiana fare, and Carpenter recommends three standouts that shouldn't be missed. (especially when the chef herself is guiding you in their direction).

Start with Oysters Beatrice, adorned with creamed greens, absinthe, house bacon and parmesan cheese.

Then decide on one of her two recommended main courses (or get both, especially if you can share with a fellow food lover). Sink your teeth into Mammaw's Fried Chicken, which starts with three piece of dark meat that are fried to order and served with pepper jelly, house relish and a fluffy biscuit. Or celebrate the oceans, rivers, lakes and

bayous with a fresh catch that always highlights the best fish with seasonal ingredients, locally grown vegetables, and whatever creative preparation the chef feels each day.

Weekend brunch draws a lively crowd — especially among the city's Bloody Mary-loving queer citizens. And the patio brings together friends old and new, whether it's during "Happiest Hour" Tuesday through Thursday or a moonlit dinner.

With so much love and attention to detail going into every bite, sip and inch of the space, it's no surprise Restaurant Beatrice was one of 10 Finalists for Best New Restaurant by the James Beard Foundation in 2023, representing Dallas, Cajun/Creole cuisine and LGBTQ leadership on a national level.

And it's also no accident that Restaurant Beatrice sums up so much of Carpenter's experience.

"The cultural fabric of our society has benefited immensely from the contributions of the LGBTQ community. I couldn't imagine a world without the color, creativity, inclusivity, generosity, selflessness, imagination, and flavors that are born out of queer genius."

And that's exactly what you'll find on the menu and beyond during any visit.

And there are plenty more of those around these parts in every nook and cranny. Check out the plethora of Asian cuisines in Carrollton; the longest-serving Indian vegetarian restaurant at Kalachandji's located inside a Hare Krishna temple in East Dallas, the exploding barbecue scene in Fort Worth or the mall of restaurants in Plano's Food Hall.

Looking for something else? Your mouth and stomach will be pleased with any of these dining destinations. The hardest part is narrowing down which one.

CASUAL DINING

ALLGOOD CAFE does comfort food with just enough flair to make this Deep Ellum spot special. And its live music calendar is often impressive.

One coffee shop brings the community all together now

These days, coffee shops have become more than just a place to get your morning caffeine. They're also spaces to gather and find community. Located in the Gayborhood, Union Coffee has become a hub for LGBTQ folks in Dallas.

The shop opened in 2012, sponsored

by the Oak Lawn United Methodist Church, and has flourished since its opening. In addition to serving delicious drinks, the coffee shop works to support the local community. Touted as "the most generous cup of coffee in Dallas," the proof is in the brewing as they donate more than \$25,000 a year to care for the unsheltered population of Dallas. The second-to-last Saturday of each month is their shot of generosity, where 15 percent of all sales go to a

local nonprofit.

Union is a welcoming and inclusive space for the LGBTQ people and many of the staff are part of the community. You'll find plenty of Pride flags all throughout the year. When you walk into the shop, you'll find information on events and happenings in Oak Lawn as well as rainbow Union shirts and baked goods. And it's a great place to pick up your free weekly copy of the LGBTQ newspaper Dallas Voice.

With free wi-fi and plenty of accessible outlets, plug in and get some work done at Union.

The coffeeshop does live up to it's name as a wonderful space to connect with community. The inside of the building features meeting rooms that can be reserved for local groups. Union supports three worshipping communities as well as a space to share stories and embrace vulnerability.

Outside there is an expansive lawn where customers can relax and mingle at picnic tables. It is an outstanding place to enjoy the sun and see some cute dogs. On weekends you can find the lawn filled with backyard markets featuring local artists and crafters. UnionDallas.org.

TOP TEN RECORDS

DALLAS FORT WORTH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (DFW)

DFW INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT is the fourth-busiest airport in the world. Located between Dallas and Fort Worth, it is 20 miles from downtown

Dallas and 18 miles from downtown Fort Worth. DFW is a superhub airport that welcomes more than 70 million passengers each year on more than 200 nonstop flights to destinations worldwide. It is a major economic engine for North Texas, generating over \$30 billion in economic activity each year. The airport is currently undergoing a \$3 billion renovation and upgrade project to improve the passenger experience.

DFW offers a variety of amenities for travelers, including:

THE AMERICAN EXPRESS CENTURION LOUNGE, with complimentary food and drinks, showers and comfortable seating for AmEx cardholders.

THE MINUTE SUITES NAP CENTER, private rooms and showers where travelers can rest, refresh or get work done.

THE YOGA STUDIO at DFW Airport offers a place to stretch and relax before or after a flight.

IMMIGRATION KIOSKS allow travelers to clear customs and immigration more quickly.

THE SKYLINK TRAIN is a free train that connects the airport's five terminals.

TAX-FREE SHOPPING, where travelers can save money on items such as perfume, electronics, and alcohol.

DALLAS LOVE FIELD AIRPORT (DAL)

LOVE FIELD (DAL) is a city-owned airport located in Oak Lawn. It is the second busiest airport in North Texas after Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (DFW). Love Field serves approximately 17 million passengers annually and is served by Southwest Airlines, Alaska Airlines and Delta Air Lines. The airport has two terminals, Terminal A and Terminal B, and offers nonstop flights to more than 120 destinations.

In addition to its air transportation services, Love Field also offers a variety of amenities, including:

- The Love Field Conference Center
- Shopping
- An art program that features public art and live performances

DALLAS AREA RAPID TRANSIT (DART)

Dallas' transit system, **DART**, provides transportation to and from Dallas and 12 surrounding cities. It offers modern public transportation services, including the DART Light Rail, the Trinity Railway Express commuter rail (TRE), bus routes, the Dallas Streetcar, on-demand services, and paratransit. DART moves almost a quarter-million passengers per day throughout its 700-square-mile service area. DART's Green Line Connects DFW Airport to Oak Lawn. DART.org.

MCKINNEY AVENUE TROLLEY

The **M-LINE TROLLEY**, which is operated by the nonprofit McKinney Avenue Transit Authority, provides old-fashioned streetcar service in Dallas. Riders can board at any of the M-Line stops along the route to travel to and from Uptown and Downtown Dallas, including the Dallas Arts District. MATA.org.

TRINITY METRO

The **FORT WORTH TRANSIT SYSTEM** offers varied services for passengers traveling and commuting throughout

the city and to the airport. Among its options are the TEXRail, bus routes, the mobile-friendly ZIPZONE for on-demand ridesharing, ACCESS paratransit and Fort Worth Bike Sharing. The Dash is Trinity Metro's all-electric bus that connects downtown with the Cultural District and the West 7th entertainment corridor and provides daily service as well as late night service on Friday and Saturdays. All train and bus options are wheelchair and ADA-accessible. ZIPZONE also has vehicles for wheelchair and ADA accessibility. RideTrinityMetro.org.

TRINITY RAILWAY EXPRESS

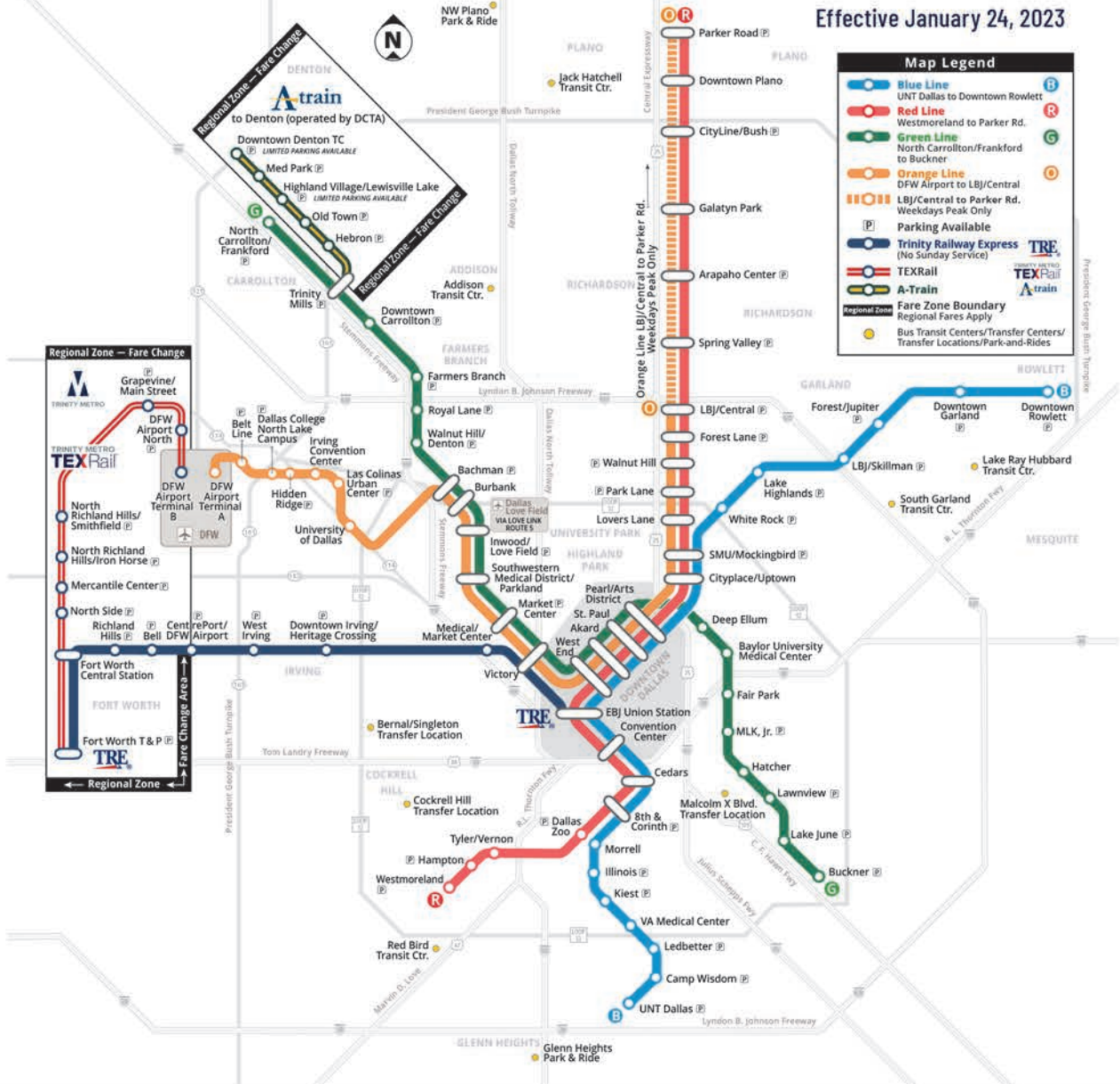

READING IS FUNDAMENTAL

There's more to the page at North Texas public libraries

One important thing when moving into a new area is knowing your resources and how to connect with the community. The public library system is one of the best places for this.

The Dallas Public Library has 30 branches, so no matter where you move in the city, there is always a location close by. And if physical libraries and books aren't your thing, they also offer countless online media including ebooks, movies, music and TV. The library provides a much needed third space for citizens to gather as well as just work and read. There are meeting rooms available to reserve and so many groups to get involved with. Whether you're looking for a book club or crafting group, you can find it here.

A highlight of the Dallas Public Library

system is its support of the LGBTQ community. For the month of June, the library hosts Pride events such as Rainbow Reading Hour and Pride crafts, as well as a community closet of gender-affirming clothing and a Rainbow Market featuring local LGBTQ vendors. No matter your age, you'll find some activity to help you express your Pride and meet other local LGBTQ folks.

The library's support of the community extends beyond just Pride Month. They host LGBTQ focused events throughout the year, including a gender affirming closet for Transgender Visibility Day. The Oak Lawn branch is the locus for LGBTQ resources and reading material.

The Dallas libraries also host weekly meetings with Prism Health North Texas, a local organization committed to providing healthcare in a non-judgmental and affirming environment.

The library system itself also has an overall focus on equity and inclusion,

wanting all to feel welcome. They have a specific statement on censorship, as they believe that "while any person is free to reject for themselves materials of which they do not approve, they cannot exercise this right of censorship to restrict the freedom of others to read, view, listen, or inquire." You'll be able to find histories, biographies, young adult fiction and more featuring LGBTQ people in the shelves of the Dallas Public Library. DallasLibrary2.org.

While the Dallas Public Library has a massive system, North Texas is home to a number of impressive library systems that serve their various neighborhoods and residents.

Between Fort Worth and Dallas, the **Arlington Public Library** hosts "book tastings," where attendees can sample different styles of books, and creative writing events for teens at their seven locations. ArlingtonLibrary.org.

The Carrollton Public Library has

two branches and features events for children of all ages, including a Teen Advisory Council for high school students. @CarrolltonTxLib.

At 17 branches strong, the **Fort Worth Public Library** system seeks to offer programming for all its residents. And they aren't short on fun, engaging activities though like weekly Trivia Tuesdays and an expanded music initiative with events for all ages. The system also manages the Fort Worth History Center which provides access to local history and genealogy resources and serves as the city of Fort Worth Municipal Archives. @FtWorthLibrary.

The Frisco Public Library hosts a community plant swap and offers classes for teens focusing on real world skills including applying to college. The library website also includes staff reading lists for Pride Month and information about their two branches. FriscoLibrary.com.

Garland Public Library's Central Branch will undergo renovations this spring to create a larger and more functional attraction for the community. Changes will include study and meeting spaces, a revamped community room and redesign childrens' area.



Renovations are expected to take a year while the actual library operates at a nearby location. Along with usual library services, GPL offers a number of creative sessions for adults and children across its four branches.

@GarlandLibraryTx.

Harvey R. "Bum" Bright Public Library mostly caters to families with

young children. The one location offers many story times and activities for parents to socialize their babies. Resources also include a resident newsletter and Hoopla streaming service with membership. HPTx.org.

An impressive **Irving Public Library** hosts one of the bigger literary events, the North Texas Teen Book Festival, held annually at the Irving Convention center. The festival brings authors and publishers from all over the country. At the end of a day that's filled with panels and Q-&-A's, teens can meet their favorite authors and have their books signed. Their three branches also offer events year-round. @IrvingLibrary.

Mesquite Public Library has two branches that are straightforward centers for books and multimedia, but it also offers a number of digital resources for language learning, continuing education and job search assistance along with community programming such as Adult Book Club, craft activities and a Teen Advisory Group. CityOfMesquite.com.

Plano Public Libraries boast 3D printing services as well as specific programs for neurodivergent patrons across its five locations. @PlanoLibrary.

DALLAS

Deep Ellum/Old East Dallas

Lakewood/Lake Highlands

Lower Greenville

Oak Cliff

- People can attend to show strength in numbers and raise more funds to support the cause or nonprofit.

Not a bad way to spend the evening. So pull up the calendar app on your phone and start filling in these dates, or visit the organizations' websites to stay updated on event information and dates to be announced. No matter what your interests are, there is likely going to be an annual event each season in this North Texas community to enjoy. So get involved and have some fun and look snazzy doing it.

House of DIFFA: The Dallas Chapter of the Design Industries Foundation Fighting AIDS holds events throughout the year to benefit local HIV/AIDS service organizations, beginning with its largest and most well-known event, House of DIFFA, a black-tie runway show and fashion gala held each spring. Bloomin' Ball: This is Access and Information Network's (AIN) annual fundraising gala to help support the organization's services and programs for people with HIV/AIDS, including the Daire Center and the nutrition program. This year's event is scheduled for August with further details to come. AINDallas.org.

Fashion Cited: Legal Hospice of North Texas serves up haute couture each year with this fashionable fundraiser that usually closes out the summer. LegalHospice.org.

FALL

Burgers and Burgundy: Hosted by DIFFA/Dallas each fall, this foodie event features a number of renowned chefs serving their own unique take on a slider, each of which will be paired with the perfect glass of wine. DIFFADallas.org.

Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?: DFW's Human Rights Campaign and North Texas LGBT Chamber of Commerce host this September-ish event where dinner locations are secret, and you never know who you might be sitting next to depending on the host. DFW.HRC.org.

The Legacy Angels PositiviTEA

Transgender Day of Remembrance: Each year on or around Nov. 20, the LGBTQ community marks Transgender Day of Remembrance to honor and mourn those trans women and men who have died violently over the previous 12 months.

WINTER

World AIDS Day: This commemorative day is marked each year on Dec. 1, by North Texas organizations such as Resource Center.

DIFFA Dallas Holiday Wreath

Collection: The official holiday kickoff event happens each November. Designers from around the country create a one-of-a-kind holiday wreath for patrons to bid on in a silent auction. DIFFADallas.org.

Red Ribbon 5K: Tarrant County AIDS Outreach Center's family- and pet-friendly 5K is held each year on the weekend closest to World AIDS Day on Dec. 1. 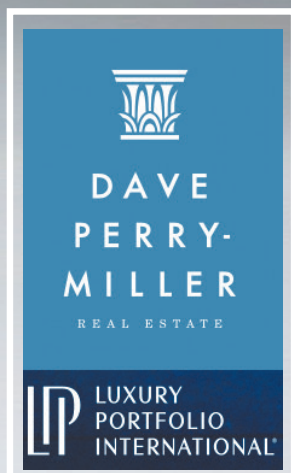

OUTDOORS

Let's go outside

Dallas and Fort Worth comprise of a sizable square footage of concrete along with bustling traffic. The buildings are sprawling, and suburbia is expanding on its own with new developments and retail. The combination can sometimes get in your head.

Does anybody get out anymore?

Thankfully yes, and, despite the sprawling cities, outdoor and greenspaces are numerous enough to satisfy nature types — or just to step away from the to-do.

Outdoor enthusiasts can get their fill of the fresh air and greenspaces here in North Texas. A variety of trails including urban ones, area lakes and city parks offer an abundance of options to let the sun shine in. Put together that cute outfit and slather some sunscreen on for these 10 outdoor experiences.

WATER

White Rock Lake: Situated just east of downtown Dallas, this lake is a haven for wildlife as well as for bikers, runners and those who enjoy major views of nature. Six playgrounds, a hike and bike trail, the White Rock Dog Park, the Bath House Cultural Center and the Arboretum are all in the lake's family here. DallasParks.org.

Lake Ray Hubbard: The massive lake near Rockwall covers more than 22,000 acres and is prime for fishing, boating and water skiing. Lakeside hotels and shopping bring some resort-style experiences to the area. Lake-Ray-Hubbard.com.

Trinity River Fort Worth: This scenic west fork of the river delivers on a true outdoor experience. Visitors can head to Panther Island Pavilion for live music, rent a kayak, take a boat tour of the area, bike along the trails or even ride a

horse, take in some riverside shopping and geocache for some added viewing of the area. FortWorth.com.

PARKS

Klyde Warren: This open-air five-acre urban park offers green space in the heart of the Dallas Arts District. Throughout the year — particularly in agreeable weather — visitors with and without dogs can enjoy a simple park visit or a slew of amenities throughout the space. The Children's Park features fountains, playgrounds, a storytelling tree and more. Restaurants and food trucks offer bites throughout the day. Yoga on Saturday mornings, Muse Family Performance Pavilion offers live music and more, snag a book or challenge a player to chess in the Reading and Games room and stroll through the botanical garden. This park kind of has it all. KlydeWarrenPark.org.



Reverchon/Turtle Creek Parks:

Located in the Oak Lawn/Uptown neighborhoods, these parks anchor the area's green space. Formerly Lee Park, Turtle Creek features lovely scenery for picnics, especially along the creek itself. Sporty types can find courts and fields at Reverchon. This park has its own baseball field along with basketball and tennis courts, and both parks access the Katy Trail. DallasParks.org.

Fair Park

Home to the annual State Fair of Texas, the park just east of downtown Dallas is open year round for folks to explore its art deco exteriors and lush green areas. See more on page (Sights and attractions). FairParkDallas.com.

Fort Worth Botanic Gardens: This verdant space is broken into three areas – the Japanese Garden, the Garden Center and the Conservatory. The gardens feature more than 2,500 species of plants across 23 specialty

gardens. Of particular note, the Japanese Garden is famous for its architecture, waterfalls and koi-filled pools. FWBG.org.

TRAILS

Katy Trail: This inner-city Dallas trail is popular for bikers, runners and those who just want a nice stroll outdoors. But it's become so much more than a trail. At 3.5 miles, from nearby the American Airlines Center in downtown up to North Dallas, the trail is a communal spot that features public art, restaurants and other features along its route. Popular events along the trail have included 5Ks, art talks, goat yoga and more. KatyTrailDallas.org.

Arbor Hills Nature Preserve: Listing this under trails doesn't do this massive land area in Plano justice, but the trails provide valuable scenery. Paved trails are great for all levels along with biking trails. The preserve is broken into zones of different landscapes including

prairie land and a forest area. Wildlife is abundant here and weekend crowds are as well, but the sights make up for it with plenty of Instagrammable locations and backdrops. Plano.gov.

Trinity Skyline Trail: This hard-surface trail gives you all the views of Dallas' skyline from the Dallas Floodway. The trail runs just shy of five miles for biking and hiking. Its vastness can be intimidating, but the wetlands offer a close up view of preserved nature in the big city. TrinityRiverCorridor.com.

Rowlett Creek Preserve: Head out to this lush parcel for some deep hiking. The trees offer canopy while open spaces also give it a sense of adventure. The preserve is somewhat off the beaten path, so fellow hikers and bikers are sparse. But it does offer space to sit and cookout if you just want a green respite. Just take bug spray.
