

#### **Superintendent Tyson Bennett** out at Sherman ISD



The board of trustees for the Sherman Independent School District on Wednesday, May 1, approved a "voluntary separation agreement" with Superintendent Tyson Bennett. The move comes in the wake Tyson Bennett of controversy over Bennett's efforts last fall to keep a trans-

gender senior at Sherman High School, Max Hightower, from playing a lead male role in the school's planned production of Oklahoma!

Bennett, who became superintendent two years ago, has been suspended with pay since early March as trustees debated what action to

"I'm thrilled that our district put the students first, ALL students," said Phillip Hightower, Max Hightower's father, who has been a steadfast advocate for his son since the controversy began. "I'm proud of our community. I'm proud of Max's courage. If even just one kid feels a little safer, a little more accepted, then we have truly accomplished something.

"To anyone else that wants their kids to be seen, loved, and valued, my advice is to get loud and stay loud. This is the fight," Phillip Hightower added.

Morgan D. — mother of a transgender student at one of SISD's two middle schools who has endured repeated harassment, including actual physical assault, over the course of the current school year - applauded the vote separating Bennett, but said the district still has a lot of work to do.

"The action taken by the board of trustees is a great start. Unfortunately, there is still a lot of work to do," she said. "There are still members on the board that have victimized minority students - LGBTQ+ and otherwise. There are also staff members in all of the schools that continue the homophobic and bigoted narrative.

#### UMC delegates repeal ban on LGBTQ clergy

Delegates to the United Methodist Church's

General Conference on Wednesday, May 1, voted overwhelmingly to repeal the denomination's ban on LGBTQ people serving as clergy, according to CBS News. The 692-51 vote to remove the rule prohibiting "self-avowed practicing homosexuals" from being ordained or appointed as ministers happened with no

This was the UMC's first General Conference in five years. As CBS News noted, "Past General Conferences ... had steadily reinforced the ban and related penalties amid debate and protests, but many of the conservatives who had previously upheld the ban have left the denomination in recent years, and this General Conference has moved in a solidly progressive direction.

Delegates also approved a measure prohibiting district superintendents from penalizing clergy for either performing a same-sex wedding or for refraining from performing one, and prohibiting superintendents from forbidding or requiring a church from hosting a same-sex

# Recognizing and treating intestinal parasite

ello, Woof readers. I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather and getting excited for the summer that is around the corner. This month I will be discussing the infamous intestinal parasites that we find affecting our dogs and cats.

As a veterinarian, I've seen many cases of intestinal parasites in dogs and cats over the years, and we tend to see more of them when the weather is nicer, because that's when we start taking our dogs outside more and more. Unfortunately, intestinal parasites are very common here in Texas, and both dogs and cats can become infected with them.

Now there are certainly some common myths about intestinal parasites. People tend to think that all parasites look like spaghetti and that if they if they don't see any of that, then their pets don't have any intestinal parasites. Well, here's a wake-up call: Many parasites are microscopic and may not even be seen in the stools. In fact, even those spaghetti-like parasites are in microscopic form only, meaning you may not see anything abnormal on your kiddo's stools.

Some people think if a dog or cat lives strictly indoors, they will not be exposed to any type of parasite. But I have seen many of these strictly indoor pets turning positive for the presence of different kinds of intestinal parasites. Many of these pets do go outside, if only briefly, and we can bring microscopic intestinal parasites inside our homes on our shoes.

There are different types of intestinal parasites, including the long worms that we typically think of, which are usually roundworms or hookworms. These are transmitted through

the ingestion of microscopic eggs found within stools or in contaminated areas, and this can happen when our pets step on stool traces that may have the microscopic eggs and then lick their paws. Many of these eggs can live in the environment for weeks or even months.

A common intestinal parasite here in the South is the tapeworm, which is transmitted through the ingestion of a flea infected with a microscopic stage of the tapeworm. The adult worm segments (called proglottids) look like grains of rice and will be seen in the stools or around our pets' anuses. Sometimes you may also see your pet (espe-

cially dogs) scooting when these parasites are present, although that can also be an indication of a different issue like anal sac disease.

Remember that some parasites — like giardia and coccidia — can only be found in their microscopic forms, and they can be transmitted through exposure to contaminated areas where stools were present, including water sources when it comes to giardia. Intestinal parasites in the environment can be very difficult to eradicate and can often continue to expose our kiddos, affecting them over and over again.

The most common symptom associated with the presence of intestinal parasites is soft stools or diarrhea, even if no worms are seen. But dogs and cats with normal stools can still be infected with intestinal parasites, and soft stools or diarrhea are seen with many conditions completely unrelated to intestinal parasites.

These critters can also lead to vomiting, weight loss, anemia and even life-threatening complications.

In order to diagnose an intestinal parasite infection, we start with a fecal analysis, recommended at least once yearly and any time there is concern regarding stools or potential exposure to parasites. I also recommend taking a picture of any worm you see, or even consider taking the worm itself to your hospital so that you can show it to your veterinary healthcare team.

Whenever you make your appointment to see your doctor, please consider bringing a fresh stool sample from your pet with you so that the healthcare team

can process it. Your doctor may also recommend blood work and/or radiographs if your kiddo seems very sick and may suggest further testing to rule out other issues not related to the presence of intestinal parasites.

There are different types of dewormers and treatments that may be recommended, based on which parasite is present and how much damage it has caused to your pet. Sometimes all that you need is a specific oral dewormer, but some poor babies may be so sick from an advanced intestinal parasite infection that they need hospitalization.

Preventing the spread of these common intestinal parasites requires controlling the environment. Many heartworm and flea/tick prevention products these days have dewormers against the common intestinal parasites. It is very important to always pick up the stools right after your pet has gone to the restroom to help prevent parasites from lingering in the surroundings. I also recommend avoiding areas where pets visit often if you suspect or know your baby has intestinal parasites, as your pet could expose other pets to the parasites.

It's worth noting that many of these parasites can infect humans, so please please consult a physician if you suspect exposure.

# A script no one would buy

What's happening in today's headlines is too unbelievable even for Hollywood

n Hollywood the term "Green Light" means a project is a "go." It takes a lot of planning, a lot of schmoozing, a good deal of influence and — most of all — a good script or treatment to get a project green-lighted. Without a good story, it's rare that a picture or TV show gets made.

How do I know that? Well, in the deep, dark past of the last century, I made a couple of pitches to the networks, and, both times, they said the story wasn't believable.

I would love to see those same network execs being pitched something from today's headlines. The Trials of Donald

Trump as a mini-series would get pretty much the same response: "It's not believable!"

What is happening today wouldn't even make

good fiction; it's just too ridiculous.

A former president, wrapped in numerous civil and criminal cases, standing trial for multiple felonies while running for the office he once held? No one would buy this tripe, especially the part



where he still holds the Republican Party in a vice grip and still has people eager to vote for him.

We have entered the Bizarro World, where all the rules are flipped on their head and the implausible becomes reality. What's worse is that some LGBTQ folks are actually Trump fans. That really shows how bizarre things have gotten.

And here's a plot twist: A well-known porn star from both gay and bisexual films has been convicted of punching a police officer during the Jan. 6 insurrection! Steven Miles, known by his nom-de-porn as Sergeant Miles, was sentenced to two years in prison followed by another year of supervised release.

"Nope, that story is not believable. Go back and write something we can believe actually happened."

But hey, the story has more porn stars, not to mention hush money and fraud and even the National Friggin Enquirer! There's something for everyone. And if you want something off-color, there is even the whole flatulence angle about a defendant who farts nonstop while glaring at the jury and mumbling.

Nope. It's just not believable.

Additional blame falls on the elected leaders who have successfully polarized the public into camps that are willing to believe anything if it supports their cause. Politicians manipulating their constituents with fear and boogiemen, especially those on the right, find new scapegoats almost daily to send shivers down their voter's spines: Gay people coming for your children! Drag queens! Transsexuals! Pizza parlor pedophile rings!

This story would never sell. And yet, in a post-Trump world, it seems we will see a lot more implausible events playing out. Comedians don't even have to write jokes any more; they can just read the headlines.

It makes me long for the days of Watergate and White House Plumbers. At least that was a story that might get a green light.

# Coming OUT against cancer

#### **LGBTQ HEALTH**

American Cancer Society encourages regular screenings, good healthcare for the LGBTQ community


BS Texas Chief Meteorologist Scott Padgett will emcee Come Out Against Cancer, an event featuring Dallas Wings forward Emma Cannon with music from Los Angeles DJ Roland Belmares, happening May 10 from 7-10 p.m. at the Lorenzo Hotel.

The American Cancer Society put the event together to address the importance of cancer screenings in the LGBTQ community in North Texas. Early detection can save lives when it comes to fighting cancer, ACS notes. But numerous studies have shown that more than one-third of the LGBTQ community has experienced discrimination in a health-care setting due to sexual orientation or gender identity. And of those who have dealt with discrimination, 75 percent say the negative treatment had an impact on their health care.

According to the American Cancer Society, one in two men and one in three women will be diagnosed with cancer sometime in their lifetime. And if you're not diagnosed with cancer, chances are very high someone close to you will be.

Dr. Asad Dean is an oncologist with Texas Oncology, a presenting sponsor of Come Out Against Cancer. He said risk can be reduced with a good diet, exercise and not smoking. Recommended screenings can detect cancer early, and early detection means better chances for successful treatments, he said.

Also as a cancer preventive, Dean recommends the HPV vaccine. Current guidelines advise the shot up to age 45. It's not that older people can't contract the HPV virus, but the vaccine was developed as a preventive for teenage girls

before they were sexually active, and its efficacy was extended to young men and then to those a little older.

The HPV vaccine can prevent cervical, vulvar and vaginal cancers in women and penile and anal cancers in men.

Along with the vaccine, Dean recommends regular PAP smears in women to detect cervical cancer.

Dean also suggests annual mammograms for women, with new guidelines recommending starting at age 40. "And," he said, "every woman needs to know how to do a self-exam." He said women should learn to do a breast self-examinations at younger ages. And if they feel a lump, they need to get professional care. He said doctors should be teaching their patients how to do a self-exam, but there are instructions with pictures online.

"The absence of having children can be a risk factor for breast and cervical

cancers," he said, which is an explanation for higher rates of breast cancer among lesbians and bi women.

But studies show another factor is disparities in access to healthcare. More than half of LGBTQ people report poor treatment by healthcare professionals making many in the community reluctant to seek care.

For men, Dean recommended a PSA screening annually, beginning at age 50, to detect prostate cancer for those with no family history. Start those annual screenings earlier if you have close relatives who have had prostate cancer. If the PSA level is elevated, see a urologist who may decide to biopsy the prostate, especially if they feel a lump.

Colonoscopy is a preventive screening for colon cancer. Despite the cleansing process, Dean called it "worth it to check for polyps."

If you are hesitant about having a colonoscopy and have no hereditary risk of colon cancer, Dean recommended non-invasive Colo-Guard. That method checks any blood found in a stool sample, and, Dean said, it is quite effective.

African-Americans are about 20 percent more likely to contract colorectal cancer and 40 percent more likely to die from it. Dean said there are a number of reasons for that, including being diagnosed later and discrimination in healthcare that includes being less likely to have a doctor recommend a screening.

Skin cancers are the most common forms of cancer, and basal cell and squamous cell cancers are the most common types of skin cancers. These two forms of skin cancer are generally caused by too much sun without sunscreen protection. Melanoma is considered the deadliest type of skin cancer because it tends to spread. A dermatologist can freeze spots on the skin while they're precancerous and remove a mole to be biopsied.

A higher rate of smoking in the LGBTQ community leads to higher rates of lung, esophageal, kidney, bladder and other types of cancer. Preventing those cancers begins with not smoking.

Diet can also play an important role in preventing cancer: "Eliminate as much processed food as possible," Dean said. "Eat less red meat and more fish and poultry, whole grains, lentils and beans." Also eat more fruit and vegetables and less sugar. And physical activity is important. Those same changes to diet are also good for heart health.

"Weight is a risk factor for cancer," Dean said. "Stay fit doing activities you enjoy doing. Keep your blood circulating. Work your heart."

He suggested walking as one of the best exercises and about the easiest to monitor with apps on any cell phone.

Dean said money raised at Come Out Against Cancer will be used by the American Cancer Society not only to educate the LBGTQ community about screenings and prevention, but also to educate healthcare professionals about how to increase healthcare outcomes for their patients.



These represent a small — and tame — sampling of the daily activities at the annual Camp John Waters at Club Getaway in Kent, Conn. It's a special weekend of camaraderie with fans of the iconic moviemaker — a delightful mixture of LGBTQ and straight people who have become a large, wacky extension of my beloved chosen family. And unlike my biological one, this family's likely to engage in a dildo fight or strip naked during a twist dance contest judged by Ricki Lake.

To be fair, this is a niche within a niche. But it's proven that summer camp can be even more fun as a full-grown adult. Not only am I comfortable in my own skin now and can be as flamboyantly gay as I want to be around everyone, I have realized I still have the capacity to make new, rest-of-my-life-long connections while sitting around a campfire making s'mores or X-rated arts and crafts, discussing our newest aches and pains.

So yeah, there are undoubtedly reminders that we're no longer the invincible youth we once were (or thought we were), but the nostalgia of smelling fresh pine air while making friendship bracelets will always be hard to top.

You can be a part of this magic this summer, too. 

The organization provides informational resources and works with LGBTQ-affirming reproductive doctors, donor and adoption agencies, and foster organizations.

With Florida being one of the epicenters of anti-LGBTQ legislation and rhetoric, this kind of celebration of queer joy is more important than ever. The three founding women are all born and raised Florida girls and made the conscious decision to stay and fight against injustice in the state they call home.

"Every year, Girls in Wonderland has been this really fun, huge women's festival," Burgos said, "but we have been more than that. We always have a charity partner, and we are speaking to our attendees about our community and what's important to them from LGBTQ equality, to women's health.

"It's all part of our conversation and our commitment to our community."

Safety is a priority at Girls in Wonder-



# 'Mama's day

#### **BEHIND THE CURTAIN**

Texas native Illeana Kirven found inspo in Jinkx Monsoon for her character in 'Chicago'

ow celebrating 25 years since its landmark Broadway revival, the award-winning musical Chicago mains a captivating experience of song and dance. The glitz and glamour of 1920s jazz and liquor still resonates on stage. And the touring cast is filled with powerhouse talents of singers and dancers that bring dynamic energy to a staple of musical classics.

But one cast member is bringing a little bit of Texas to Chicago as well. Illeana "Illy" Kirven, a native Texan, is enjoying her ride as Matron "Mama" Morton, a role for which she has found a lot of inspiration. Chicago comes to Fort Worth May 10-12 as part of the Broadway at the Bass series.


As Matron Mama Morton, Kirven runs the block where all of Chicago's criminal ladies end up. Never one to turn down — or demand — a bribe, the character helps her women in prison become newspaper fodder — mostly Velma Kelly. Her signature song, "When You're Good to Mama," pretty much spells out where her motivation lies. She goes for the coin always, Kirven said.

By all accounts, the role often serves

up some big lesbian energy. Kirven said she had to do her research to get a clearer picture of who Morton really is.

"It's something because in the script, Billy Flynn will refer to her as 'they' quite often. And then he'll call her 'Diesel' and, at one time, 'Butch,' so who really knows what she is," Kirven said.

In fact, in her research, Kirven found a curious gem as well. "The script does refer to her as 'Mrs.,' which made me wonder, is there a husband? Is there a wife? All the things," she said. "It's been something to dive deep into Mama."

Ultimately, Mama is what Kirven creates her to be, and she is serving glam and strength.

"The Mama I've created uses her power and clout to get her way, but she's glam and gorgeous. She knows what she wants, and she gotta make her dollar," Kirven said.

Kirven also said she's blended other versions of the character into her own. She takes part of every other Mama Morton she's been able to see, whether it's other stage performances or even Queen Latifah's version in the movie. That includes Jinkx Monsoon's recent

run as Matron Mama Morton on Broadway.

"Oh my god, she was just wonderful. All that beauty!" Kirven said of Jinkx's version of the character. "But it was also Jinkx doing Jinkx."

The two-time *Drag Race*-winning Monsoon made Broadway history as the first drag queen to play the role on Broadway. Her tenure onstage last January broke attendance records, and Monsoon will return to the role this summer.

Kirven is a *Drag Race* fan as well, but in researching her character, she realized Monsoon was something else. "It was a whole other level of Mama, and I thought it was glorious. Her timing was perfection, and, yes, I did pull from her as well," she said.

What Kirven does like about her own Mama is that she thinks they would be good friends. She likes her even though Mama is always conniving and bribing for her pocketbook.

"I wouldn't think I'd like her, but it's hard not to," she said. "My Mama has a conscience, and she wants well for the girls — just, after she gets paid."

When the show opened in Dallas last



month for the AT&T Performing Arts Center's Broadway series, Kirven received roars from the hometown crowd. "I really didn't expect that," she said after that opening night.

Being on a major tour, it's a slight surprise that the Tyler native is based right out of her hometown. She doesn't do much performing in Texas; it's usually in

the hub cities like New York, Los Angeles or Chicago.

But if Kirven had her druthers ...

"I would do more theater here [in Texas]. I've guest directed at Tyler City Theater, but I would love to do more in Dallas and Fort Worth," she said. "I do love touring, but it is nice to be home."

Think food presentations rather than buffets, a la carte menus without surcharges, Italian food that will make you forget what country you're in and-madeto-order tacos that you just might eat six of in one sitting. Even room service is included.

If your party books five rooms for at least three nights each, the wedding is free at these properties. Sure, you can up the package with more bells and whistles for more cash. But the basics are all yours. Color me shocked.

And I was really delighted to find out that the Karisma brand is super committed to diversity, including LGBTQ weddings and culturally-focused weddings. They can even get you a camel if you want one. They offer all kinds of groovy venue options, too, like a clear platform over a crystal pool or a "wedding in the clouds" on their Sky Terrace.



My final assumption was that all-inclusives are bare minimum kinds of places that cater to folks who want a lot for a little but don't care much about anything beyond endless drinks and chicken nuggets. Margaritaville Island Reserve and



its partner properties are anything but that. Truly.

The spa there is other-wordly. It just may have been the best massage I have ever had in fact (thank you, Wendy). And they have this very cool and VERY



relaxing hydrotherapy experience that includes multiple showers and pool jets and a sauna and steam room — oh my! I was in heaven.

And if you really want to do something kitschy and fun, you can order up

a taco boat. Yes, you read that right: a taco boat. It's a boat full of tacos along with ceviche, chips and guacamole floated right out to you in the pool. I think they say it feeds four-to-six, but I'd say more like eight-to-ten. There's an upcharge for it, and you have to book in advance, but it's definitely worth it. It's so fun and all the rage on Tik Tok, I hear.

This place has some really clever concepts, including a meat sommelier at IWB Steakhouse, an oceanfront brewery called LandShark and a DIY mini bar for which guests are given points at check-in that they can use to shop at Joe's Mercantile to stock up as they please.

Plus: No keys! A bracelet they give you at check-in does it all. Love that. There's even a molecular gastronomy restaurant at Azul Beach Resort that is minutes away from Margaritaville Island Reserve Riviera Maya called Le

Chique that is just the epitome of cool. Led by Chef Jonatán Gómez Luna, each course was a culinary surprise that was a delight to every one of the senses. Nothing was what it looked it to be, and every single dish made you go, "Wow!"

Gold leafed orbs that popped in your mouth. Walnuts that weren't. Nests and puffs and fish bone-shaped bites. Even a taco that looked like a feather duster. It was out of this world. And every bite was as delicious as it was fantastical looking. No wonder Le Chique landed as number 17 on Latin America's 50 Best Restaurants list.

The best part, though, was the people. Everyone on staff was super nice; the guests were friendly. It was a truly happy vibe, and I was very sad to say goodbye to the multiple pools and the foam party and the water aerobics and the dinner shows and the local market right in the resort and — well, you get the idea.


Sadly, the beach there has almost completely eroded away. But the resort wall butts up almost right against the sea, which gives the lovely sense that you're aboard a ship — which makes sense since that's exactly what the property looks like as you pull up after a barely 15-minute drive from the airport, which is SO nice.

I travel — a lot. And I go on a lot of cruises. But there is always something magical — and romantic — about traveling with Olivia. Maybe it's the theme nights that my wife and I always go all in for — like Fiesta de Flores, Nauti Night and White Hot Heat on this one. Or maybe it is the late nights dancing — in the Crow's Nest bar at "Club O" with DJ Christie James and DJ Olga T for this trip.

Or maybe it is the incredible entertainment. This trip alone boasted musical guests Cris Williamson, Antigone Rising and BETTY, as well as comedians Karen Williams and Suzanne Westenhoefer. And there were even incredible panels with Jaymes Black, president & CEO of Family Equality; Imani Rupert-Gordon, executive director of NCLR; Kelley Robinson, president of HRC, and Sarah Kate Ellis, president and CEO of GLAAD. I left each discussion feeling inspired — and a teeny bit smarter too.

I was excited to see so many new guests — 450 of the 1,400 total, in fact, were new, and there were more trans women than I had ever seen onboard before. The times they are a changing, and it's a beautiful thing.

Not to bury the lead, but the wildest part is that the cruise, which started in San Diego, began with *A Classic Evening with Lily Tomlin*. I still cannot believe she was right there in front of me, performing all of the characters I love and bringing new ones to life. I just kept pinching myself. Truly.

Tomlin has performed on Olivia before, so I was curious about what her fondest memory might be. She said, "I think my favorite Olivia memory is that rush of excitement with my sense of appreciation and love that I feel from the Olivia travelers every time I do a show on the ship. It's as if we have our own special club that reflects our closeness, our passion and our compassion for all of us."

There were a zillion activities going on onboard, from bingo to dance lessons, and one of the busiest was pickleball. It made me curious about Tomlin's take on the pickleball phenom to which lesbians seem as hopefully devoted to at sea as they do on land.

"I'm not sure why lesbians are fascinated with pickleball — maybe because it's an easy game for younger and older people, especially those who thrived

on sports in high school or college," she said. "I don't play much pickleball. But I admire all those who can smash that ball into the far left corner for a score!"

We got to see old friends on the trip, including Julie and Danny from Oregon, with whom we had a blast, and we met



a ton of new friends, too, including two couples, Mary and Diana and Lisa and Dana from California, with whom we're going to keep in touch for sure.

One chilly day at sea, Mary edited papers while I made bracelets and the other four girls played Rummikub. It was like all of my summer camp dreams come true. And now, I am already exchanging daily texts with Mary with our Wordle scores. Nerds unite!

There's a lot of that onboard, a meeting of the minds and connecting of souls, especially for many of us who often feel like we're from the land of misfit toys. It was something I could not stop thinking about as I danced with abandon to Pink's "Raise your Glass" in Club O. I was tearing up, watching everyone dance so freely and thinking about all of the people in the room who had been rejected over the years and yet found nothing but joy and acceptance on the trip. It was nice. Really, really nice.

Many of my afternoons I spent walking laps around the ship. One day, groups of women cheered me on every time I walked by. I couldn't help but think what a better world this could be if we all just danced together and cheered each other on no matter how small the

endeavor.

We also had the chance to visit a fab lesbian joint in Puerto Vallarta called Elixir Mixology Bar. The drinks were delicious, and the vibe was super cool. My wife and I are adding to our PV must do list for future trips for sure!

It was an amazing trip, as it always is, and I encourage all lesbians and LGBTQ women to take an Olivia Travel trip someday. It's a feeling of acceptance like none other. And a heck of a lot of fun.

In the meantime, in light of everything going on in the world, I also asked Tomlin what words of hope or wisdom she might have for the LGBTQ community, particularly the younger set: "I know we frequently have a sense that the world is going to pieces, but I see only a positive future for the entire LGBT community, in part because of the younger generation's acceptance of diverse lifestyles and ethnic groups," she said.

"Fifty years ago, we had to be so secretive that our anxieties were often inflamed just by that fear of recognition. In spite of the various attempts to constrain, restrict or repress the members of our community, I see a far greater strength of our youth. They are standing up against this current swing of the history pendulum to the right, and I am convinced it will swing back to the left. Soon. But, for the moment, we have now."






